1	Q.	Please state your name and business address.		
2	A.	My name is William (Bill) R. Davis. My business address is One Ameren Plaza,		
3	1901 Chouteau Ave., St. Louis, Missouri.			
4	Q.	By whom and in what capacity are you employed?		
5	A.	I am an Economic Analysis and Pricing Manager for Union Electric Company		
6	d/b/a Ameren Missouri ("Ameren Missouri" or "Company").			
7	Q.	What is the purpose of your testimony?		
8	A.	My testimony supports the tariff revisions to Ameren Missouri's Schedule No. 6 –		
9	Schedule of Rates for Electric Service, which is being filed by Ameren Missouri to adjust			
10	residential	customer rates for changes in the applicability of Ameren Missouri's Energy		
11	Efficiency Investment Charge Rider ("Rider EEIC"). The following tariff sheets to implement			
12	the changes are attached as Schedule WRD-1:

17	Q.	Please explain why Ameren Missouri is filing a revision to its Rider EEIC at		
18	this time.			
19	A.	Ameren Missouri is filing a revision to its Rider EEIC with the sole purpose of		
20	implementi	ing a previously-approved exemption for qualifying low-income customers. In		

1 Ameren Missouri's active rate case¹, the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission")

2 approved a Non-Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement ("Stipulation") regarding the details of

the low-income exemption. For convenience, I have attached the Stipulation and the

Commission's order approving the Stipulation as Schedules WRD-7 and WRD-8 respectively.

In addition, the Commission rules require this filing to be made at least sixty (60) days in

advance of when rates would become effective. Therefore, this filing is being made at least 60

days in advance of the June 2015 billing month, which is when the low-income exemption will

become effective.

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Q. Please describe the proposed changes to Rider EEIC to implement the low-

income exemption.

A. First I will note that, consistent with the terms of the approved Stipulation, the Energy Efficiency Investment Rate ("EEIR") has been based on the same data provided in the November 2014 Rider EEIC filing² adjusted only to reflect the low-income exemption for the remainder of the tariff-effective period. Schedule WRD-2 includes the direct testimony from the November 2014 Rider EEIC filing which contains a description and quantification of the revenue requirements and other specifics related to the calculation of the EEIR. Specifically in this case, the only change is a reduction in the November 2014 forecasted residential kilowatt-hour ("kWh") to reflect the fact that fewer residential customers will be charged the EEIR (because a portion of customers will be exempt) and, therefore, the EEIR must be increased to all other residential customers to cover the shortfall caused by the low-income exemption.

There are also wording changes to several Rider EEIC tariff sheets to implement the lowincome exemption. The first slight wording changes can be found on Sheet 90 where the

- 1 applicability has been altered to exempt "low-income" customers. Then, on Sheet 90.1, a
- 2 definition of "low-income" customers was added to be consistent with the terms of the
- 3 Stipulation; that is residential customers who, in any of the prior 12 billing months, have
- 4 received assistance from any of the following qualifying low-income programs: Missouri Energy
- 5 Assistance (a.k.a. Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program or "LIHEAP"), Winter Energy
- 6 Crisis Intervention Program ("ECIP"), Summer ECIP, Keeping Current, and Keeping Cool.
- 7 Finally, there was a slight addition to Sheet 90.4 to further clarify that the EEIR is not applicable
- 8 to low-income customers (as defined in the tariff).

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Q. Please describe the impact of the change in the Energy Efficiency Investment Rate ("EEIR") on the Company's customers.

A. First, consistent with the terms of the Stipulation, only the residential class is impacted by this change. As mentioned previously, the only change is to the residential kWh used to calculate the EEIR. The updated calculation results in the following EEIR amounts for the Company's customers during that Effective Period, beginning with the June 2015 billing month:

Filed concurrently with my direct testimony is the tariff sheet that contains the EEIR, along with the relevant subcomponents. The new EEIR will cost residential customers an additional \$0.17 per month, while the qualifying low-income customers will save over \$7 per month.

Q. What action is Ameren Missouri requesting from the Commission with respect to the revised Rider EEIC rate schedule that the Company has filed?

A. As provided by 4 CSR 240-20.093(4), the Commission Staff ("Staff") has thirty (30) days from the date that the revised Rider EEIC rate schedule is filed to conduct a review and make a recommendation to the Commission as to whether the rate revision complies with the Commission's rules (the requirements of Section 393.1075, RSMo) and, presumably, the terms of the Stipulation. If the Commission finds the revised Rider EEIC rate schedule does comply, the EEIR will take effect either pursuant to a Commission order approving the EEIR or by operation of law, in either case within sixty (60) days after the EEIR is filed. Ameren Missouri believes its filing satisfies all of the requirements of applicable statutes, the Commission's rules and the approved Stipulation. Therefore, Ameren Missouri requests that after Staff's review, the Commission approve the EEIR to become effective with the June 2015 billing month.

Q. Are there other filing requirements which need to be provided?

A. The rules require that Ameren Missouri provide the Annual Report required by 4 CSR 240-93(8). That report was filed on February 27, 2015, in File No. EO-2015-0210. There is a 60 day comment period and no party has filed comments yet. In addition, I have attached the supporting documentation as Schedules WRD-3, WRD-4, WRD-5, and WRD-6.

Q. Does this conclude your direct testimony?

A. Yes, it does.
