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## PROCEEDINGS

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2 JUDGE GRAHAM: I'm going to go on the record. I've got whatever the time is, eight minutes after 3 10:00. It's December 9, 2019. The Commission set this 4 time for a Procedural Conference in the case captioned 5 6 as Patricia Sue Stinnett vs. Kansas City Power & Light, 7 EC-2020-0088. 8 I'm Paul Graham. I'm the Regulatory Law Judge 9 in this matter. We're going to begin by the attorneys 10 and others making their entries of appearance. Ms. 11 Stinnett, by entry of appearance I simply mean or we 12 simply mean that you will formally announce your 13 presence for the record. That doesn't mean you have to 14 talk in a formal manner. Just tell us your name and 15 tell me you're here for yourself. 16 MS. STINNETT: I'm Patricia Sue Stinnett and I 17 am here. JUDGE GRAHAM: Okay. Thank you very much. 18 19 And will Commission staff enter its appearance? 20 MS. ASLIN: Casi Aslin for Staff Counsel. My 21 information has been provided to the court reporter. 22 Thanks. I don't think we're JUDGE GRAHAM: 23 going to have anybody here from OPC. That's the Office 24 of the Public Counsel lest they speak up now. 25 Mr. Steiner, do you want to go ahead and enter your

1 appearance then? 2 MR. STEINER: Yes. My name is Roger W. I'm an attorney for Evergy. My address is 3 Steiner. 4 1200 Main Street, Kansas City, Missouri, and 5 816.556.2314 is my phone number. 6 JUDGE GRAHAM: All right. Thank you very 7 That's Evergy Missouri West? much. 8 MR. STEINER: That's right. 9 JUDGE GRAHAM: Okay. Now, are there any 10 preliminary matters to take up before we begin this 11 procedural conference? Hearing none. And I was 12 thinking I might hear something about the fact that this 13 complaint has been brought against Kansas City Power & Light Company. Any comments that I need to be concerned 14 15 about today in that regard, Mr. Steiner? 16 MR. STEINER: I don't think so. 17 JUDGE GRAHAM: I read your answer to the 18 complaint. I did not think there was going to be any 19 issue, but I just wanted to put that out on the table if 20 you had anything to say about it. 21 MR. STEINER: I'm just trying to make sure 22 that my entity -- Even though it was against KCP&L, I 23 believe Evergy Missouri West is the company that provides service. That's who I entered my appearance 24 25 on. I think we're good.

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JUDGE GRAHAM: As I understood your answer, 1 2 you were answering for Evergy Missouri West and, in 3 essence, entering their appearance in the case. MR. STEINER: Correct. 4 5 JUDGE GRAHAM: Did I understand what you were 6 doing there? Is that what your thought was? 7 MR. STEINER: You did, yes. 8 JUDGE GRAHAM: Okay. So the short answer to 9 my question then is we don't have an issue at least that 10 we need to be concerned about today in any matter? 11 MR. STEINER: We do not. 12 JUDGE GRAHAM: Thanks very much. I'm going to 13 go ahead then and turn this all over to you to go ahead 14 and to set up your schedule. Ms. Stinnett, what that 15 means is I'm about to walk out of the room for good for this morning. The folks around the table here and on 16 17 the phone, you're going to do whatever you do at this 18 point on the record. 19 Will staff prepare the proposed procedural 20 order --21 MS. ASLIN: Yes. JUDGE GRAHAM: -- at the end of this exercise? 22 23 When could we expect to see that do you think? Look at 24 your other stuff. 25 MS. ASLIN: Ten days. So we could do the

19th. 1 JUDGE GRAHAM: That's fine with me if that's 2 3 fine all the way around. Is that fine with you, Mr. Steiner? 4 5 MR. STEINER: It is. I did have one 6 preliminary item before you leave, Judge. 7 JUDGE GRAHAM: Okay. Go ahead. 8 MR. STEINER: My answer had a motion to 9 dismiss and was wondering if the judge will entertain 10 that or do I need to file a separate motion? Sometimes 11 the judge wants it separately. Or if you're not going 12 to entertain a motion to dismiss, our position is we 13 followed our tariffs and there's really not anything we 14 can do. That will be great to know and I won't bother 15 the court with one. JUDGE GRAHAM: Well, I'm certainly not going 16 17 to take up and rule on the motion to dismiss one way or 18 the other today. 19 MR. STEINER: I know that. 20 JUDGE GRAHAM: Well, I didn't really think 21 that you were saying that and I knew you knew it, but I 22 said that also for the benefit of Ms. Stinnett here who 23 wouldn't necessarily follow those procedures. The 24 overwhelming likelihood, Mr. Steiner, is I'm going to just take that with the case. 25

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MR. STEINER: Thank you. That's all the 1 2 clarity I need. Thank you. JUDGE GRAHAM: All right. Anything else, 3 folks? 4 5 MS. ASLIN: Do you have a preference for have 6 you thought about whether we would be doing rounds of testimony or testimony at the hearing? 7 8 JUDGE GRAHAM: In other words, prefiled 9 testimony? 10 MS. ASLIN: Correct. 11 JUDGE GRAHAM: Mr. Steiner, do you have any 12 thoughts on that particularly --13 MR. STEINER: No. 14 JUDGE GRAHAM: Okay, the short answer. 15 MR. STEINER: We can do it either way. The 16 complainant may not know what prefiled testimony is. So we'd have to explain that. You'd have to file something 17 18 in writing. We can accommodate either. 19 JUDGE GRAHAM: Well, I've read the complaint, 20 I've read your answer, I've read your motion to dismiss. 21 My sense at this point without prejudging anything is 22 that this case may turn more on the law and on the 23 tariff. Let's put it this way. There may be more 24 disputes that turn on the tariff and on legal questions

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than turn on the facts. If I'm misstating that or if

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they shape up in a different way as this case develops, 1 2 then that's just the way it will be. MR. STEINER: We can discuss it, Judge. 3 We can discuss it offline and we'll figure out how we're 4 5 going to present it to you. We'll tell the complainant 6 what that means. You have to put questions and answers 7 on paper if that's something she wants to do. So we can 8 discuss it. 9 JUDGE GRAHAM: That may be more convenient to her too to do it that way. I'm thinking more in terms 10 11 of how to best present the issues to the Commission for 12 their decision, and my sense here is I may want to see 13 some things in writing. What I'm really thinking about 14 is things in the nature of briefs that deal with these 15 questions, and that's got nothing to do necessarily with 16 prefiled testimony although I certainly see a lot of 17 prefiled testimony that is a great proportion of that 18 turns out to be legal argument, which I always find 19 somewhat amusing. 20 I'm just going -- We've kind of hashed through 21 Why don't you all talk together about that and it here. 22 we'll look at that as a work in progress, in other 23 words, the answers to those questions. Okay? Anything 24 else? 25 MR. STEINER: Thank you, Judge.

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JUDGE GRAHAM: All right. I'll leave you all to it. Thanks very much. MS. STINNETT: Thank you. Have a good day. (Off the record.) 

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
