ORDER GRANTING VARIANCE

On March 10, 2014, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (GMO) filed an application requesting a variance from the annual surveillance filing requirement of the Commission's Demand-Side Programs Investment Mechanism rule as set forth in 4 CSR 240-20.093(9). The rule would require GMO to file its annual DSIM surveillance report on March 13 along with its fuel cost adjustment mechanism. GMO intends to file its fuel cost adjustment mechanism on March 13, but asks to be allowed until April 7 to file its DSIM surveillance report. The company explains that it needs the extra time to ensure that the annual DSIM information is consistent with the Demand-Side Program Annual Report it will file on March 31. On March 12, Staff filed a response advising the Commission to grant the variance GMO seeks.

Commission rule 4 CSR 240-20.093(13) allows the Commission to grant a variance from any provision of that rule for good cause shown. The Commission finds that GMO has shown good cause for its requested variance and will grant that variance.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company is granted a variance from the requirements of 4 CSR 240-20.093(9) so that it may file its annual Demand-Side Investment Mechanism Surveillance Monitoring Report on April 7, 2014.
2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
