ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

On May 13, 2014, the Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers ("MIEC") filed a timely motion to intervene in the above-captioned matter. MIEC represents large industrial consumers. MIEC has an interest in the implementation and enforcement of the Renewable Energy Standard Requirements and the solar rebate program that is different from the general public. Its interests may be adversely impacted by a final order in the file. Furthermore, MIEC's intervention may serve the public interest by assisting the Commission's record for decision in this matter.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(3) authorizes the Commission to grant an application to intervene if the party has an interest different from that of the general public which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case, or if granting intervention would serve the public interest. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(15) allows parties ten days to respond to motions. No party objected to MIEC's motion.

Upon review of the unopposed application, the Commission finds MIEC meets the standards set in Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(3). Therefore, the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers' *Application to Intervene* is granted.
 - 2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
