MISSOURI DIVISION OF ENERGY APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

COMES NOW the Missouri Department of Economic Development –

follows:

Division of Energy¹ (Division of Energy) and, pursuant to Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075, respectfully requests that the Commission issue its order granting the Division of Energy's Application to Intervene. For its Application, the Division of Energy states as

- 1. On December 17, 2015, Union Electric Company d/b/a/ Ameren Missouri ("Ameren Missouri") filed its LED Lighting Update Report in compliance with the Nonunanimous Stipulation and Agreement Regarding MEEIA Low Income Exemption and LED Streetlight Issues and a revised tariff to reflect a lower monthly rate for LED street lights with an effective date of January 16, 2016.
- 2. On December 17, 2015 the Commission issued a *Notice of Tariff Filing and Order Establishing Time to File Recommendations* with an intervention deadline no later than December 24, 2015.

¹ The Division of Energy was transferred from the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to the Department of Economic Development (DED) on August 29, 2013 by Executive Order 13-03. The Executive Order transfers "[A]ll authority, powers, duties, functions, records, personnel, property, contracts, budgets, matters pending, and other pertinent vestiges of the Division of Energy from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources to the Missouri Department of Economic Development…"

- 3. The Division of Energy is a state agency vested with the powers and duties set forth in Section 640.150, RSMo.
- 4. DE's interests are different than those of the general public, as illustrated by its statutory authority to plan for future energy needs and energy resource development; develop, promote, administer and monitor energy conservation programs;² consult and cooperate with all state and federal governmental agencies on matters of energy research and development, management, conservation and distribution; and analyze the potential for increased use of energy alternatives and make recommendations for the expanded use of such alternate energy sources and technologies.³ DE's intervention, moreover, will serve a public interest, as DE will evaluate the filing from a formal state policy and planning perspective consistent with its interests in clean, affordable, abundant energy, and its efficient use.
- 5. On December 17, 2015, in support of the proposed tariff, Ameren Missouri submitted its LED Street and Outdoor Area Lighting Report which finds that about twothirds of Company-owned street and outdoor area lights have technically and economically feasible LED alternatives. Ameren Missouri proposes to implement a five year conversion program which, once complete, will result in a reduction of approximately 62,000MWH in energy use and almost 60,000 metric tons of carbon production annually. DE has an interest in the proposed conversion program as it may relate to more efficient use of energy and planning for future energy needs.
