**THE OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC COUNSEL’S OBJECTION TO THE RENEWABLE
CHOICE PROGRAM NON-UNANIMOUS STIPULATION AND AGREEMENT,
MOTION TO SUSPEND EFFECTIVE DATE OF TARIFF SHEETS, REQUEST FOR
HEARING, AND REQUEST FOR PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

COMES NOW the Office of the Public Counsel and, within the seven days allotted by rule 4 CSR 240-2.115(2)(B), hereby:

- (1) Objects to the Non-Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement of Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, the Missouri Department of Economic Development – Division of Energy, Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., the Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers, Wind on the Wires, the Natural Resources Defense Council, the Sierra Club, and Renew Missouri Advocates d/b/a Renew Missouri filed on April 13, 2018;
- (2) Requests that the Commission further suspend the effective date of the tariff sheets Ameren Missouri filed to implement its Renewable Choice Program (currently the Commission has suspended them for 30 days so that now they become effective May 25, 2018) for an additional period of 90 days to investigate them and to hold a hearing;
- (3) Requests that the Commission hold a hearing; and

(4) Requests that the Commission establish a procedural schedule in this case.¹
