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Page 3 1 PROCEEDINGS 2 JUDGE BURTON: Today is September 19, 2013, 3 and the time I'm showing is currently two o'clock --2:03 actually in the p.m. 4 My name is Kim Burton. I'm the regulatory 5 law judge that is assigned to the two matters in 6 7 question. We have before us File No. ET-2014-0027 in 8 the matter of Kansas City Power & Light Company's Request for Variance from Portions of 4 CSR 240-20.065, 10 as well as File No. ET-2014-0028 in the matter of KCP&L 11 12 Greater Missouri Operations Company's Request for Variance from Portions of 4 CSR 240-20.065. 13 14 Now, at this point I would ask that the 15 parties go ahead and state their name on the record and provide your address for the court reporter. 16 17 We'll go ahead and begin with KCP&L. 18 MR. STEINER: This is Roger W. Steiner, 1200 Main Street, Kansas City, Missouri 64105, appearing 19 for KCP&L and KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company. 20 21 JUDGE BURTON: Mr. Steiner, could you also provide your phone number? 22 23 MR. STEINER: 816-556-2314. JUDGE BURTON: Okay. And on behalf of the 24 Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission. 25

Page 4 1 MR. BERLIN: Thank you, Judge. 2 Let the record reflect that Robert S. Berlin 3 is appearing on behalf of the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission. Our address is Post Office 4 5 Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. 6 JUDGE BURTON: And on behalf of the Office of 7 Public Counsel. MR. MILLS: On behalf of the Office of Public 8 Counsel and the public, my name is Lewis Mills. My address is Post Office Box 2230, Jefferson City, 10 Missouri 65102, and my telephone number is 573-751-1304. 11 12 JUDGE BURTON: And on behalf of Missouri 13 Solar Energy Industries Association. 14 MS. SHOEMYER: This is Wendy Shoemyer on 15 behalf of Missouri Solar Energy Industries Association. My address here is 210 East Love, Mexico, Missouri 16 17 65265, and Phone No. 573-581-8373. JUDGE BURTON: Okay. On behalf of 18 Brightergy, LLC. 19 20 MR. BERLIN: Judge, no attorney for 21 Brightergy but we do have a representative. 22 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. A representative. 23 MS. BROWN: Susan Brown with Brightergy.

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Page 5 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. And we have it on 1 2 record as intervening party as the Missouri Department 3 of Natural Resources. MR. KNEE: That's correct. 4 5 Jeremy Knee, Assistant Attorney General, appearing on behalf of the Division of Energy, which is 6 7 now a part of the Department of Economic Development, and initially intervened in this case as the Department 8 of Natural Resources. It's the same entity. I think for clarity we'll call it the Missouri Division of 10 11 Energy. 12 The address will be P. O. Box 899, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, and the phone number is 13 14 573-751-8795. 15 JUDGE BURTON: Are there any other parties that I've missed? 16 17 Okay. Hearing none, I'll go ahead and address first the issue of we do have two separate file 18 numbers here, but because we had the same entities 19 involved, I went ahead and just decided to have one 20 21 prehearing conference. Now, it will be up to the parties to decide, 22 23 you know, if we progress to the hearing stage or to the

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evidentiary stage, whether or not they want to go ahead

and have the two separate files, have the same

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- 1 deadlines, have the same hearing and we can resolve the
- 2 same matters at the same time or if they want to submit
- 3 separate schedules.
- 4 Okay? So it doesn't make a difference to me.
- 5 The parties can go ahead and decide on that. I don't
- 6 know if you've had an opportunity to address this issue
- 7 beforehand, but after we go off the record, be my guest
- 8 to discuss away.
- 9 Now, the main reason we have this prehearing
- 10 conference is so that the parties can get together and
- 11 kind of discuss and see if they can reach a settlement
- 12 on some of the issues that are in dispute.
- Now, Mr. Steiner, we do have obviously your
- 14 application for clarification, reconsideration and/or
- 15 rehearing for Kansas City Power & Light Company and for
- 16 GMO that's still on the record as being filed.
- 17 No response has been submitted as far as any
- 18 responses for the motions from any of the parties within
- 19 the ten days that is allowed by regulation.
- 20 Before the Commission decides to go ahead and
- 21 rule on that, I'm going to allow the parties to
- 22 hopefully discuss the matter today, see if you can reach
- 23 a settlement on some of the issues, and if you want to,
- 24 go ahead and submit a settlement agreement to the
- 25 Commission as far as what issues are in dispute or what

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- 1 issues the parties can concur on. All right?
- Now, I'm looking at a timeframe here, and for
- 3 those parties that are on the line, you obviously don't
- 4 have the calendar in front of you, but I have provided a
- 5 paper copy of the hearing schedule from now through the
- 6 end of December, so that if we do progress to the
- 7 hearing stages, you can take a look at this to see what
- 8 dates would work for a possible hearing.
- 9 So you'll be able to discuss that with the
- 10 parties that are on the line, Mr. Mills, Ms. Shoemyer
- 11 and Mr. Steiner as well.
- 12 But I'm also looking at a deadline for the
- 13 parties to go ahead and submit to me a status report as
- 14 far as any settlement discussions that you might have
- 15 today after we go off the record, as well as a proposed
- 16 procedural schedule.
- 17 And if it comes down to a procedural
- 18 schedule, I would ask the parties to submit deadlines
- 19 for any data requests, discovery issues for the taking
- 20 of different stages of evidentiary testimony but also
- 21 for any addressing of position statements, issues of
- 22 witnesses and cross-examination orders.
- Okay. Is there anything else that the
- 24 parties need to say before I suggest that we go ahead
- 25 and say one week from now I would like to have that

- 1 status report and proposed procedural schedule to me?
- 2 MR. BERLIN: Judge, just a clarifying
- 3 question.
- 4 Can it be a status report or does it also
- 5 have to be a proposed procedural schedule?
- 6 And the reason I ask is because we are
- 7 working on these issues and trying to get them resolved.
- 8 So it may be a possibility we might file a status report
- 9 at that point in time, recognizing that we won't have a
- 10 need for a procedural schedule.
- 11 JUDGE BURTON: That is absolutely fine with
- 12 me. If the parties decide that you need a little bit
- 13 more time to see if you can work out an agreement,
- 14 that's acceptable.
- 15 Please just let me know in the status report
- 16 and a suggested date that the parties can agree to say,
- 17 okay, by this timeframe we'll either give you a final
- 18 status report or a proposed procedural schedule.
- 19 I realize we have a deadline right now that
- 20 we're looking at the law date for -- I believe it's
- 21 December 26 for both of these tariffs. I also realize
- 22 that these tariffs were suspended for 120 days, and we
- 23 can suspend it for a little bit more if we need to to
- 24 kind of ensure that we have sufficient time for the
- 25 parties to say let's see what we can do as far as

Page 9 working on a settlement and, you know, worst case we'll 2 still have enough time for a full hearing and evidence 3 without stressing everyone out too much around the holidays. 4 5 Is there anything else before I go ahead and take this off the record? 7 MR. STEINER: I don't believe there is anything else, Judge. 8 9 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. 10 Mr. Mills, Ms. Shoemyer, do you have anything 11 else? 12 MR. MILLS: No, not at this time. Thank you. 13 JUDGE BURTON: Okay.
