## STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE TARIFF SHEETS ALLOWING THE COMPANY TO USE CREDIT SCORING TO DETERMINE WHEN TO ASSESS A NEW **CUSTOMER DEPOSIT**

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, by and through counsel, and in support of this Recommendation to Approve Tariff Sheets, states:

- On December 9, 2013, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri ("Ameren Missouri") filed tariff sheets<sup>1</sup> to change the criteria the company uses to determine whether to assess a deposit on new customer accounts for natural gas and electric service.
- On January 29, 2014<sup>2</sup>, the Commission issued an Order Consolidating 2. Cases, in which File No. GE-2014-0180 is consolidated into File No. ET-2014-0076.
- Also on January 29th, the Commission issued its Order Adopting 3. Procedural Schedule in which it set a settlement conference on February 21st and ordered that Staff file a recommendation in the matter no later than February 28th if the parties did not reach an agreement. Staff requested and was granted an extension until March 7<sup>th</sup> to allow more time for the parties to attempt to reach a settlement on the filed electric and natural gas tariff sheets in this matter<sup>3</sup>. Despite the parties participating in

multiple settlement discussions attempting to reach a resolution satisfactory to all parties, a settlement will not be reached before Staff's recommendation is due.

- 4. Accordingly, Staff has prepared its Recommendation to Approve Tariff Sheets, attached hereto as Appendix A (Memorandum and Attachments 1-6) and incorporated by reference, which details Staff's investigation and conclusions. Staff recommends the Commission approve the electric and natural gas tariff sheets submitted in this case which allow Ameren Missouri to use credit scoring when determining when to assess a new customer deposit.
- 5. In its application, Ameren Missouri initially requested a variance from Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-13.030. However, recently the Commission has revised Rule 4 CSR 240-13.030 to allow for the use of credit scoring as is currently sought by Ameren Missouri, which will become effective on March 30, 2014<sup>4</sup>. Because Ameren Missouri's proposed tariff sheets have an effective date of April 8<sup>th</sup>, a variance from the rule is not necessary.<sup>5</sup>

WHEREFORE, Staff hereby tenders its Recommendation to Approve Tariff Sheets, for the Commission's information and consideration.
