- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Welcome, everyone, to the
- 3 conference I scheduled for two cases, GE-2014-0180,
- 4 which is Ameren Missouri's gas tariff.
- 5 THE COURT REPORTER: Oh, just a second.
- 6 Sorry. Okay. Go ahead.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: As I was saying, we're
- 8 here for a prehearing conference in GE-2014-0180,
- 9 which is Ameren's gas tariff, and, also,
- 10 ET-2014-0076, which is Ameren's electric tariff.
- 11 We'll begin today by taking -- we're going
- 12 to have a combined conference on these two cases,
- 13 and we'll discuss later what we want to do with the
