**ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO INTERVENE**

On September 4, 2013, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company ("GMO") filed the above referenced application and tariff. On September 12, the Commission received a motion to intervene from Wind on the Wires.

Wind on the Wires pleads that it is a non-profit corporation dedicated to wind energy's fair access to the electric transmission system. As such, it has an interest different from that of the general public that may be adversely affected by a final order in this file.

The Commission allowed parties until September 19 to object to the motion. No party objected.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4) allows the Commission to grant intervention to a person who has an interest different from that of the general public and which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case, or if granting intervention would serve the public interest. Upon review of the unopposed application, the Commission finds that the applicant meets the standard in Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4). Therefore, the Commission will grant the motion to intervene.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The Motion to Intervene filed by Wind on the Wires is granted.
2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
