**ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO RESPOND TO PROPOSED PROCEDURAL
SCHEDULE**

On September 30, 2013, Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri created this file with a pleading entitled Notice of Tariff Issue and Motion for Expedited Order. Ameren Missouri's motion explained that in the near future it would be approaching the maximum average one percent retail rate impact provided for by Section 393.1030.2(1), RSMo. As a result, it might soon need to file a tariff to cease paying solar rebates and planned to negotiate about these matters with interested stakeholders. On October 11, Ameren Missouri indeed filed its Application for Authority to Suspend Payment of Solar Rebates, Request for Variance, and Motion for Expedited Treatment.

Ameren Missouri's motion explains that pursuant to a recent statutory change enacted in HB 142, the Commission must rule on the company's request to suspend payment of solar rebates within 60 days. To assist the Commission in completing an evidentiary hearing and issuing a decision within the time allowed by law, Ameren Missouri's motion sets out a proposed procedural schedule for the filing of testimony, leading to a hearing on November 8. Given the limited amount of time available for

completion of the hearing process, the Commission will direct the other parties to promptly respond to Ameren Missouri's proposed procedural schedule.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Any party wishing to respond to the procedural schedule proposed by Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri as part of its Application for Authority to Suspend Payment of Solar Rebates shall do so no later than October 17, 2013.
2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
