ORDER SUSPENDING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On September 22, 2014, the Commission issued an order setting a procedural schedule in this matter and suspending the tariff filed by KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company ("GMO") until December 31, 2014. The procedural schedule provided deadlines for filing lists of issues, statements of position, stipulated facts, briefs and a date for oral arguments before the Commission.

On October 20, 2014, GMO, the Commission's Staff, the Office of the Public Counsel, and Earth Island Institute d/b/a Renew Missouri filed a non-unanimous partial stipulation and agreement ("Agreement"), which they all signed. Two intervenors, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri and Ag Processing, Inc., did not sign the Agreement. The Agreement proposes a new procedural schedule, including an evidentiary hearing, that conflicts with the procedural schedule established by the Commission. In order to provide time for possible objections to the Agreement and for the Commission to consider the Agreement and a revised procedural schedule, the Commission will suspend the procedural schedule established by its order of September 22, 2014.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The procedural schedule established by the Commission on September 22, 2014 is suspended until further order of the Commission.

2. This order shall be effective when issued.
