Specifically describe any barriers to the diffusion of CHP over which Empire has control and could remove, as well as the implications this removal would likely have on Empire's load.

3. Describe and evaluate the various technologies and strategies (e.g., energy

efficiency, renewables, CHP) by which Empire foresees complying with Section 111(d).

Highlight their projected importance in achieving this compliance.

4. Investigate and analyze the change in load that Empire anticipates will be

effected by increased electric vehicle use. Please consider any applicable federal or state

incentives (e.g., the recent passage of MO SB 729) in this context.
