- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Well, let's go
- 3 ahead and go on the record. Good morning. Today is
- 4 January 2nd, 2007, and we are here for a prehearing
- 5 conference in the matter of the application of the
- 6 Citizens of Iron County, northwest end of Reynolds County,
- 7 Edgehill and Black area for change of electric supplier,
- 8 Case No. EO-2007-0155.
- 9 My name is Harold Stearley, and I'm the
- 10 presiding officer in this matter. The court reporter this
- 11 morning is Monnie VanZant. And we will begin by taking
- 12 entries of appearance, beginning with Staff of the
- 13 Missouri Public Service Commission.
- 14 MR. WILLIAMS: Nathan Williams, Deputy General
- 15 Counsel, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Williams. And
- 17 AmerenUE?
- 18 MS. FRENCH: Maureen Jacqueline French, AmerenUE
- 19 Associate General Counsel, P.O. Box 66149. St. Louis,
- 20 Missouri, 63166.
- 21 JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Ms. French. And
- 22 Black River Electric Cooperative?
- MR. REED: Scott Reid, Post Office Box 151,
- 24 Fredericktown, Missouri, 63645.
- 25 JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. And Citizens of

- 1 Iron County, Northwest End of Reynolds County and Edgehill
- 2 and Black area? And let the record reflect that we have
- 3 no entry of appearance for the Citizens of Iron County, et
- 4 al. And, also, let the record reflect we have no one
- 5 present for the office of Public Counsel.
- 6 When the Commission issued its November 28th,
- 7 2006, order setting the prehearing conference in this
- 8 case, we advised the Citizens group that if they wanted to
- 9 proceed as an association, they needed to retain legal
- 10 counsel, as no individual of the group could represent the
- 11 group as a whole or the other individual members.
- 12 And it was brought to my attention last week
- 13 that the group -- the Citizens, et al., may not be
- 14 interested in having legal counsel and may, in fact, be
- 15 interested in voluntarily dismissing this action as filed
- 16 and proceeding with perhaps separate complaints or
- 17 applications.
- 18 Do any of the other attorneys have any other
- 19 insight into this at this point?
- 20 MR. WILLIAMS: Judge, although this is -- the
- 21 release that's been requested is a change of supplier, it
- 22 appears to me that the allegations that appear in the
- 23 filing deal more with service quality issues, and this is
- 24 more in the nature of a complaint case.
- 25 And I would point out that the statutes that

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- deal with complaints, whenever there are complaints
- 2 regarding rates, there's a requirement that not less than
- 3 25 consumers or purchasers or prospective consumers or
- 4 purchasers have to sign a petition in order to obtain
- 5 relief from the Commission. And, also, that appears at
- 6 386.390(1).
- 7 And I would also point out that under sub 2, it
- 8 reads, All matters upon which complaint may be founded may
- 9 be joined in one hearing and no motion shall be
- 10 entertained against the complainant for misjoinder or
- 11 causes of action or grievances or misjoinder of
- 12 non-joinder parties.
- 13 And the Commission's Rule 240-2.070(12), echoes
- 14 the statutory language regarding joiner or parties. And
- 15 it appears to me like what you have are a number of
- 16 parties that have made complaints as opposed to an
- 17 association that's come forward. But that's Staff's view
- 18 on the matter.
- 19 JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. And it does appear
- 20 to me as well that this is more in the area of complaints
- 21 of service issues as well.
- 22 Any -- any comments from Ameren or Black River
- 23 regarding this? I noticed in all the responses, the
- 24 parties moved that the action be dismissed.
- MS. FRENCH: Right. We agree with the

- 1 characterization of -- of it that it had not been
- 2 regarding this.
- 3 MR. REID: Yeah. And on behalf of Black River,
- 4 we would agree, too, that this appears to be primarily a
- 5 service issue complaint.
- 6 JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Well, at this
- 7 point, I had had an Order, also, for a procedural
- 8 schedule, and I'm going to suspend that order at this
- 9 time.
- 10 The Commission can examine, I suppose, if we're
- 11 going to treat this matter as a complaint or if it needs
- 12 to be filed through the complaint process.
- 13 My understanding from the individual who
- 14 contacted me last week as part of this group in asking
- 15 about the procedural context and the requirement for an
- 16 attorney that individual complaints may be filed and may
- 17 be consolidated.
- 18 Staff, do you have any other information
- 19 regarding that?
- 20 MR. WILLIAMS: It seems to me that that could be
- 21 done, and we'd likely end up in the same place we are now.
- 22 JUDGE STEARLEY: That's -- that's exactly where
- 23 we probably will end up. Yeah. So I guess we can -- we
- 24 can look at whether or not we're going to start with the
- 25 informal complaint process with these parties and move

- 1 through, or if we can look at regarding this application
- 2 with a petition attached as being treated as a complaint
- 3 moving forward on that basis, which might expedite having
- 4 the -- these individuals go through filing individual
- 5 complaints and being consolidated at a later time.
- Is there -- is there any party here that would
- 7 be in opposition to that, this application being treated
- 8 as a complaint and moved forward from this basis?
- 9 MR. WILLIAMS: Staff certainly doesn't oppose
- 10 that.
- MS. FRENCH: No, your Honor.
- MR. REID: Black River has no opposition to
- 13 that.
- 14 JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Very well. Are
- 15 there any other matters that we need to address for the --
- 16 for the moment today of the prehearing conference?
- 17 MR. WILLIAMS: I believe not. But if the other
- 18 parties would stay on the line after we're done, I would
- 19 like to speak with them a bit.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Very well. Well, at this
- 21 point, this will conclude the record portion of our
- 22 prehearing conference, and we will go off the record.
- 23 And as I indicated, I will suspend that
- 24 requirement for a procedure schedule be filed till next
- 25 week till we determine how we're going to move forward

with this particular application and/or complaint. Thank you all very much for being here this morning.
