4	We'll begin today by taking entries of
5	appearance beginning with Ameren Missouri.

7	Avenue, St. Louis, Missouri 63103.
8	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for Staff.
9	MS. HERNANDEZ: Jennifer Hernandez, Nathan
10	Williams, and John Borgemeyer appearing on behalf of
11	Staff. Our address is P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City,
12	Missouri 65102.
13	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Public Counsel.
14	MS. BAKER: Thank you. Christina Baker and
15	Lewis Mills, Jr., appearing on behalf of the Office of
16	the Public Counsel, P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City,
17	Missouri 65102.
18	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you.
19	And for KCP&L and GMO.
20	MR. FISCHER: Let the record reflect the
21	appearance of James M. Fischer, Fisher & Dority, PC,
22	101 Madison, Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri
23	65101.
24	JUDGE WOODRUFF: For Laclede Gas Company.
25	MR. ZUCKER: Rick Zucker here on behalf

3	JUDGE WOODRUFF: For the Missouri
4	Department of Natural Resources.
5	MS. FRAZIER: Jennifer Frazier with the
6	Missouri Attorney General's Office, P.O Box 899,
7	Jefferson City, 65102.
8	JUDGE WOODRUFF: For NRDC, Sierra Club,
9	Renew Missouri. Is someone on the phone?
10	MR. HO: Hi. This is Bruce Ho from NRDC,
11	2 North Riverside Plaza, Suite 2250, Chicago,
12	Illinois.
13	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And is Mr. Robertson on
14	the line, or was he going to join us
15	(No response.)
16	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Henry Robertson?
17	MR. HO: I'm not sure. I thought he was
18	going to join.
19	JUDGE WOODRUFF: He called yesterday and
20	asked to join.
21	(Phone rang.)
22	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Maybe that's him there.
23	Did someone just join us?
24	MR. VOYTAS: Yes. This is Rick Voytas in

St. Louis.

1	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay, Rick. All right.
2	Well, Bruce, what was your last name?
3	MR. HO: Ho. It's spelled H-o.
4	JUDGE WOODRUFF: H-o. Okay. And are you
5	the attorney representing NRDC?
6	MR. HO: I'm on behalf of NRDC staff, but
7	I'm not our counsel.
8	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay.
9	(Phone rang.)
10	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Did someone just join us
11	on the phone?
12	MR. ROBERTSON: Henry Robertson.
13	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right, Mr. Robertson.
14	We got you just in time to enter your appearance.
15	MR. WILLAN: This is Bob Willan with
16	Ameren.
17	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Mr. Robertson, did you
18	want to enter your appearance?
19	MR. ROBERTSON: I have not filed an entry
20	of appearance. I can do that.
21	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Do you wish to?
22	MR. ROBERTSON: I didn't know I needed to.
23	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Well, I don't know that
24	you need to.
25	MS. TATRO: I don't think he understands

1	that you're just asking him to state his name and
2	address for the record, that you're not asking to make
3	a final
4	MR. ROBERTSON: Oh, you wanted me to
5	okay.
6	JUDGE WOODRUFF: We have just started the
7	hearing and we're just going through the list of
8	attorneys who are here participating
9	MR. ROBERTSON: Yes.
10	JUDGE WOODRUFF: so Henry Robertson.
11	MR. ROBERTSON: Henry Robertson.
12	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. And you're
13	representing NRDC, Sierra Club, and Renew Missouri?
14	MR. ROBERTSON: Yes.
15	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Thank you.
16	For Barnes Jewish Hospital?
17	MS. LANGENECKERT: Lisa Langeneckert of the
18	law firm of Sandberg, Phoenix, and von Gontard. Our
19	address is 600 Washington Avenue, Suite 1500,
20	St. Louis, Missouri 63101, appearing on behalf of
21	Barnes Jewish.
22	JUDGE WOODRUFF: For MIEC.
23	MS. ILES: Carole Iles and I'd also
24	like to enter an appearance for Diana Vuylsteke, who
25	will be appearing in this case Bryan Cave, LLP,

JUDGE WOODRUFF: I believe that's all the

parties and the entities that have requested the

intervention. Any other attorneys representing

parties that I haven't listed?

(No response.)

JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. The first item of business is to deal with the applications to intervene, and there have been several that have applied to intervene.

Ameren -- actually, I issued an order last week indicating that anyone wishing to respond to any of those applications to intervene, that they do so by yesterday. No such responses were filed, so I'm going to be taking up all the applications to intervene as unopposed, and I will grant them. That would include -- grant the application of Laclede Gas

Company; grant the application to intervene of

Missouri Department of Natural Resources; grant the motion to intervene of Sierra Club, Earth Island

Institute doing business as Renew Missouri, and the National Resources Defense Council; grant the application to intervene of Barnes Jewish Hospital; grant the application to intervene of the Missouri

Industrial Energy Consumers, and I believe that would

1	be everybody.
2	MR. FISCHER: Judge, have you already
3	accepted the application of KC
4	JUDGE WOODRUFF: I must have gone past
5	that, but I will grant the application to intervene of
6	Kansas City Power and Light and KCP&L and GMO. I'm
7	not sure what happened to those.
8	Okay. Well, I scheduled this conference
9	so that the parties could get together and discuss
10	how they wish to proceed in this case. My first
11	question is that the regulation requires action within
12	120 days, and it's my understanding in a KCP&L, GMO
13	similar proceeding that was just filed, they agreed to
14	extend that past 120 days. I'll leave that up to you
15	as to whether you want to do that or not in this case.
16	I understand that the existing programs
17	will expire on July 1. Is that correct, Ms. Tatro?
18	MS. TATRO: Or June 30.
19	JUDGE WOODRUFF: June 30?
20	MS. TATRO: June 30.
21	JUDGE WOODRUFF: So I assume we don't want
22	to go past that as far as getting a decision, unless
23	you can work out some other kind of deal.
24	I also noted that Ameren had suggested a

procedural schedule that included hearings on, I

Ţ	believe, the 11th and 12th of April.
2	MS. TATRO: I don't remember the dates
3	exactly, but mid-April.
4	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And I noticed on the
5	calendar that April 11 is not available on the
6	calendar.
7	MS. TATRO: Okay.
8	JUDGE WOODRUFF: There's already a hearing
9	scheduled for that day.
10	MS. TATRO: We will certainly work around
11	the Commission's calendar.
12	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Very good.
13	What I'd like you to do is give me a
14	recommended procedural schedule by next Monday,
15	February 6, and we'll get moving right along on this
16	case.
17	Is there anything anyone wants to bring up
18	while we're on the record? Any other matters?
19	MS. TATRO: Not from Ameren Missouri.
20	Thank you, your Honor.
21	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you all, and with
22	that, we'll adjourn the on-the-record portion of this
23	proceeding, and I'll leave you to your discussions.
24	(The hearing concluded.)
