## ORDER FURTHER EXTENDING TIME TO RESPOND TO FILINGS

Issue Date: September 3, 2014 Effective Date: September 3, 2014

The Commission established this working case to consider the potential impacts of current and future Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) rules on the reliability and cost of the electric generation plant operated by Missouri's electric utilities. To that end, the Commission directed Missouri's investor-owned electric utilities, and invited other interested stakeholders, to answer certain questions in writing by August 25, 2014. Furthermore, the Commission directed utilities and other stakeholders that wished to respond to the August 25 written submissions to do so by September 2. On August 28, Sierra Club filed a motion requesting that all parties be allowed until September 9 to file those responses. The Commission granted that motion on August 29. On September 2, Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed a motion seeking one more week, until September 16 to file responses. Again, the motion explains that more time is needed to prepare a response to the extensive filings that were made on August 25.

Once again, the Commission will grant the motion for extension of time.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Ameren Missouri's Request for Additional Time to Submit Replies is granted.
- 2. Any utility or other stakeholder wishing to respond to the written submissions filed on August 25, 2014, shall do so no later than September 16, 2014.

3. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
