The Commission has created several rules to implement the Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act (MEEIA). Each of those rules provides that the Commission is to review the effectiveness of the rules no later than four years after the effective date of the rules. On October 24, 2014, the Commission's Staff filed a motion asking the Commission to open a working case to assist in the conduct of that review. To that end, the Commission will invite interested stakeholders to respond with comments by November 14 to the following requests:

- a. Please comment as to the effectiveness of the MEEIA rules;
- b. Please suggest proposed changes to the MEEIA rules. These suggestions need not be in the form of a draft amendment, but should include citations to the language that would be amended if the proposed changes are effectuated, and should explain the policy or other rationale supporting the proposed change;

c. Please comment as to any issues that should be addressed in proposed amendments to the MEEIA rules not presently included in the rules.
