Pursuant to 4 CSR-240-2.075(4)(A)

- Dias has an interest which is different from that of the general public
- Dias' rights are not protected by the Public Counsel
- Dias' business interest are not unlike that of Wal-Mart who has been granted the right to Intervene
- Dias' business interest are with the customers of KCPL which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this rate case
- The (Commission) has jurisdiction and statutory authority to grant the relief requested



Flawed Futuristic Model of Electrical Demand

- KCPL choose a zip code in Johnson County and one in Grandview
- In the hearings mandated by the Commission, KCPL did conspire, scheme, connive, plot and made a conscience discussion that this information should be kept from the public; obviously concerned that press and public scrutiny might end up producing an adverse public reaction that could destroy the project (See Direct Testimony of Gary C. Price on behalf of DOE)
- KCPL specifically proposed a "Low-Profile Strategy" designed to keep the details of the rate increase out of the public view
- KCPL has requested an (11.5%) increase in its charges for electrical services to it Missouri Service Area based on current demand levels that have been projected into a futuristic model of electrical demand

DIRECT TESTIMONY OF GARY PRICE ON BEHALF OF D.O.E

- KCPL is requesting an 11.5% increase wanted over 20% to residential class
- KCPL plans to address the difference in future rate design cases (Only if all rate classes are level)
- KCPL states that an increase of more than 11.46% would add undue burden to customers
- KCPL will not address issues related to rate increase because they plan to help customers manage their energy bill (HOW)
- KCPL wants the (Commission) to approve the rate increase than they will address the burden on the customers (It will never happen)

The Cover-up

- KCPL made a conscience discussion to keep the details from the press and public scrutiny
- KCPL was concerned that details of the rate increase could produce an adverse public reaction
- KCPL elected to removed the weatherization program as contemplated
- "Low-Profile Strategy" to meet with churches an other organizations then pull the weatherization program

CONCLUSION

- This effort could reduce KCPL's futuristic model of electrical demand substantially by some estimates 3 to 5% which would reduce the futuristic need to purchase power by 3 to 5%.
