## ORDER OPENING AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A LOW-INCOME CUSTOMER CLASS OR OTHER MEANS TO HELP MAKE ELECTRIC UTILITY SERVICE AFFORDABLE

Over the last several utility rate cases, the Commission conducted numerous local public hearings around the state regarding requests for rate increases. Many witnesses at those hearings testified that any rate increase places a heavy and disproportionate financial burden on low-income residential customers. The Commission wants to hear from utilities, organizations, individuals, and other stakeholders on ideas to reduce the financial burden on low-income customers while providing a fair and adequate return to the regulated utilities.

The Commission wants stakeholders to specifically address the feasibility and advisability of establishing a low-income customer class based on the federal poverty level. Comments should include an analysis of : 1) the practicality of establishing such a class, including the effect on revenues and costs, 2) proposed guidelines for inclusion in such a class, 3) proposed verification procedures for participants, 4) the effect on the company's bad debt expense, 5) similar low-income rate-classes established in other

states, 6) the legality of establishing a low-income rate-class and 7) the appropriate rate or rate-formula for a low-income rate-class.

In addition, the Commission wants stakeholders to address any other means by which to assist low income residential customers (i.e., California's Low Income Oversight Board and programs administered by the California Public Utilities Commission such as the Energy Low Income Program (CARE), the Energy Savings Assistance Program, and the Family Rate Program (FERA)).

This file will serve as a repository for documents and comments. Using this file, any person with an interest in this matter may view documents and may submit comments or documents. As this is not a contested case, anyone may file a comment without legal counsel and without *ex parte* constraints. Intervention requests are not necessary to submit comments or view documents.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Interested utilities, organizations, individuals, and other stakeholders may file initial comments and enter exhibits addressing the financial burden on low-income electricity consumers no later than September 7, 2012.
- 2. Interested utilities, organizations, individuals, and other stakeholders may file reply comments responding to any analysis or proposals brought forth in the initial comments by September 24, 2012.
  - 3. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
