

The Commission finds that Consumers Council's interest in this case is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing Consumers Council to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

To facilitate further discussion about Ameren Missouri's proposal and tariff, the Commission will schedule a conference. The participants in that conference should be prepared to discuss whether Ameren Missouri's tariff should be suspended. If the tariff is to be suspended, then the parties will need to discuss a procedural schedule for the consideration of Ameren Missouri's proposal and tariff. The conference will be held in conjunction with the conference to consider Ameren Missouri similar proposal and tariff for natural gas service pending in GE-2014-0180.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Application to Intervene of the Consumers Council of Missouri is granted.
2. A conference to discuss Ameren Missouri's proposal and tariff is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on January 24, 2014, at the Commission's office at the Governor Office Building, Room 305, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City, Missouri. This building meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act.
