ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

On October 22, 2018, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed an application with the Missouri Public Service Commission seeking an order granting a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) pursuant to section 393.170, RSMo 2016. The CCN would authorize Ameren Missouri to construct, own, and operate a wind generation facility to be constructed in Atchison County, Missouri. The Commission ordered that any person wishing to intervene do so by November 2. Fairfax R-3 School District applied to intervene on November 13. That application was accompanied by a motion requesting leave to late-file the application to intervene. That motion indicates counsel for the school district simply overlooked the deadline and represents that no party will be prejudiced by allowing the late intervention.

More than ten days have passed since Fairfax R-3 School District applied to intervene and no one has responded to either the application or the motion to late-file. After considering the unopposed application to intervene, the Commission finds that allowing Fairfax R-3 School District to intervene will serve the public interest. Further, the Commission finds good cause to grant the late-filed application to intervene in that no party will be prejudiced by the short delay in the filing of that application. Therefore, in

accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(3) and (10), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Fairfax R-3 School District's application to intervene is granted.
2. This order shall be effective when issued.
