# ORDER GRANTING APPLICATIONS TO INTERVENE AND ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO CONSOLIDATE

Issue Date: December 27, 2018 Effective Date: December 27, 2018

On November 29, 2018, Kansas City Power & Light Company and KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (collectively, "the Companies") applied to the Commission for approval of certain demand-side programs, a Technical Resource Manual, and a Demand-Side Investment Mechanism as contemplated by the Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act and the Commission's implementing regulations. The Commission received timely intervention requests from: West Side Housing Organization; National Housing Trust; Spire, Missouri, Inc.; The Missouri Division of Energy; Midwest Energy Consumers Group; Renew Missouri Advocates d/b/a Renew Missouri; and Natural Resources Defense Council.

The Commission ordered that objections to intervention requests must be filed by December 26, 2018. No party objected to the intervention requests. Thus, the Commission will take the applications for intervention up unopposed.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4) allows the Commission to grant intervention to a person who has an interest different from that of the general public and which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case, or if granting intervention would serve the public interest. Upon review of the unopposed applications, the Commission finds that the applicants meet the standard in Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4). Therefore, the Commission will grant the applications to intervene.

Further, the Companies, the Staff of the Commission, and the Office of the Public Counsel ask the Commission to consolidate these cases. No party opposes the motion. Taking up the unopposed motion to consolidate, the Commission finds these two cases involve related questions of law and fact such that consolidation is permissible under Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.110(3). Thus, the Commission will grant the motion to consolidate.

#### THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The applications to intervene filed by the above-mentioned applicants to intervene are granted.
- 2. The motion to consolidate is granted, with File No. EO-2019-0132 being the lead case.
  - 3. This order shall be effective when issued.
