**ORDER SETTING PREHEARING CONFERENCE**  
**AND REQUIRING FILING OF PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

TXU Energy Services, Inc., and Schreiber Foods, Inc., Petitioners, filed their complaint on April 20, 2001. On May 9, 2001, this Commission issued its Notice of Complaint. On June 9, 2001, Missouri Gas Energy (MGE), a division of Southern Union Company, filed its Answer.

This matter is now at issue and a prehearing conference and procedural schedule are appropriate to ensure its prompt resolution. At the prehearing conference, the parties or their representatives should be prepared to discuss the nature of any discovery each will conduct and the interval necessary for its completion; the number of witnesses each expects to call at hearing; the number and nature of any exhibits each expects to offer at hearing; and the anticipated length of the hearing. The parties or their representatives should also be prepared to discuss the current status of settlement

negotiations. It is expected that the prehearing conference will provide an opportunity for the parties to further pursue settlement discussions.

The parties shall jointly file a proposed procedural schedule. The proposed procedural schedule shall establish dates for the filing of a list of issues, prepared direct, rebuttal and surrebuttal testimony, and the statements of the parties of their position on each issue. The proposed procedural schedule shall also establish dates for the hearing of this matter.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. That a prehearing conference shall be held on July 9, 2001, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The prehearing conference shall be held at the Commission's offices at the Governor Office Building, 200 Madison Street, Room 305, Jefferson City, Missouri. The Governor Office Building is a facility that meets the accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act. 2. That the parties shall jointly prepare and file a proposed procedural schedule no later than July 16, 2001.

3. That this order shall become effective on July 7, 2001.


