In addition, Ameren Missouri needs to restore services to the premises by no later than 5 pm today Monday October 23, 2023. As a result of Ameren's gross, negligent and abusive and illegal actions, I have had to come out of monies that I cannot afford to continue paying for at the expense of Ameren Missouri.

I would also suggest that Ameren Missouri clean up their act. Never ever in my life have I seen a company try to con a consumer and then stoop down to trying to HiJack an email account to gain access to documents or emails that are my own personal.

Oh and you can bet the AG's Office is going to hear about this this morning as well.

Lie and deny all you want, but it is your company's information. It is time to stop with the lies and admit responsibility.
