ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER

Issue Date: April 11, 2022 Effective Date: April 11, 2022

On January 18, 2022, Co-Mo Electric Cooperative (Co-Mo) filed an application for approval of designated service boundaries within portions of Cooper County, Missouri, to allow Co-Mo to serve a new development to be annexed into the City of Boonville. On March 16, 2022, the Commission granted Co-Mo's motion for a protective order to protect certain confidential information from potential exposure. The Commission modified that order on March 30, 2022, to allow selective access to highly confidential information.

On March 30, 2022, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed a motion for a protective order under the same terms granted for Co-Mo. The Commission ordered Co-Mo to respond. On April 4, 2022, Co-Mo filed a response to Ameren Missouri's motion indicating that it did not object to the issuance of such an order. Co-Mo identified Daniel Beck, retired Manager of the Commission's Engineering Analysis department, as its consultant and expert who should be granted access to highly confidential information.

The Commission will enter the protective order requested by Ameren Missouri but if Co-Mo or any other party believes Ameren Missouri has inappropriately designated information as highly confidential, that party may bring those concerns to the Commission for resolution.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Ameren Missouri's Motion for Protective Order is granted.
- 2. The following Protective Order is established:
 - a. Materials and information divulged by Ameren Missouri, or other parties, shall be considered "Highly Confidential" if so designated at the time of disclosure.
 - b. No employees of Co-Mo shall be permitted to view Ameren Missouri's highly confidential information
 - c. Daniel Beck, expert consultant for Co-Mo may view Ameren Missouri's highly confidential information for use during this proceeding, and for no other purpose. Daniel Beck shall:
 - i. Keep all information secure;
 - ii. Maintain highly confidential documents in a secured computer system under his exclusive control. Such documents shall not be commingled with or released to any other computer system except that of counsel for Co-Mo.
 - iii. Submit the non-disclosure form attached to this order as Exhibit

 A and file it with the Commission before viewing highly confidential information;
 - iv. Within ninety days after the completion of this proceeding, including judicial review, destroy or permanently delete all electronic and paper copies of all highly confidential information, notes, work papers, and copies preserved in the hard drives of

computers, copy machines, and devices with similar capacity;

Adhere to the confidentiality requirements of 20 CSR 4240-٧. 2.135(13).

d. Counsel for Co-Mo shall utilize secure methods for transferring information to and from the secured computer systems.

e. Persons afforded access to materials or information designated "Highly Confidential" shall neither use nor disclose such materials or information for purposes of business or competition or any other purpose other than in regard to the case referenced above and shall keep the materials and information secure and confidential and in accordance with the purposes and intent of this protective order.

- f. If a party disagrees with the "Highly Confidential" designation of any information, or if a party believes that one or more of its employees should be allowed to view the highly confidential information, the party shall follow the informal discovery dispute resolution procedures set forth in Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.090(8). If the party exhausts these dispute resolution procedures, the party may file a motion challenging the designation.
- 3. This order shall be effective when issued.
