ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

Issue Date: October 15, 2014

Effective Date: October 22, 2014

On September 22, 2014, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (GMO) issued a tariff to amend its Residential Lighting and Appliance Program to remove two measures from the "Eligible Lighting and Appliance Measures" section of the tariff. The tariff carries an October 22 effective date, but GMO initially asked the Commission to approve the tariff to take effect on October 2.

GMO explains that the tariff revision will remove two energy saving measures from the tariff. One measure that will be removed provides customers with a \$100 rebate when they purchase an Energy Star labeled refrigerator. The second measure offers a \$35 rebate to customers who install a programmable thermostat. GMO indicates the two measures are being removed from the tariff because they did not pass the Total Resource Cost screening in the 2013 Evaluation, Measurement and Verification Report prepared by Navigant Consulting, Inc.

The Commission initially ordered any party wishing to respond to GMO's motion for expedited approval of its tariff to do so no later than September 29. On that date, Staff filed

a motion seeking more time to respond to the tariff. That motion represented that Public Counsel and GMO did not object to Staff's request for more time. The Commission granted that request and extended the time to respond to October 8.

On October 8, Staff filed a recommendation advising the Commission to deny GMO's request for expedited approval because GMO had not yet provided Staff with all the information it needs to evaluate the proposed tariff. Staff indicated it would continue to seek information from GMO and would file its recommendation regarding the tariff no later than October 14.

Staff filed its recommendation on October 10. Staff indicates that it has obtained information from GMO demonstrating that the total resource cost measurements for the programs in question show that they are not cost effective. Staff recommends the Commission either approve GMO's tariff, or allow it to go into effect on its effective date of October 22. No other party has filed a recommendation regarding GMO's tariff.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company's Motion for Expedited Treatment is denied.

2. The proposed tariff sheet submitted under Tariff No. JE-2015-0125 by KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company is approved effective on and after October 22, 2014.
