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1	(The hearing commenced at 2:00 p.m.)
2	MR. SEYER: We are on the record. Today
3	is October 10th, 2023. It's 2:00 p.m. the
4	Commission has set this time for a procedural
5	conference in the case captioned Betty Bonacci,
6	complainant versus Evergy Missouri West,
7	Incorporated, doing business as Evergy Missouri
8	West, Respondent. It's the Public Service
9	Commissions Case No. EC-2023-0433.
LO	My name is Ken Seyer, and I'm the
L1	regulatory law judge in this matter. And we'll
L2	begin by having the attorneys for the parties make
L3	their appearances starting with Mr. Steiner.
L4	MR. STEINER: Thank you, Judge. Can you
L5	hear me?
L6	MR. SEYER: Yes.
L7	MR. STEINER: Roger W. Steiner appearing
L8	for Evergy. My address is 1200 Main Street, Kansas,
L9	Missouri 64105.
20	MR. SEYER: Mr. Thompson.
21	Mr. Thompson, I believe you're muted.
22	MR. THOMPSON: Well, that's not going to
23	work.
24	Thank you, Judge. Kevin Thompson for the
25	staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission,



1 Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City Missouri 65102. 2 MR. SEYER: All right. And then 3 Ms. Bonacci. 4 MS. BONACCI: Yes. Betty Bonacci. 15225 5 Grand Summit Extension, Apartment 203, Grandview, 6 Missouri 64030. 7 MR. SEYER: Okay. So I will confess, I am 8 new to this case. I was just assigned this case a 9 few weeks ago. Are there any preliminary matters 10 that the parties would like to take up today? 11 MS. BONACCI: Yes. I have one. 12 MR. SEYER: Go ahead, Ms. Bonacci. 13 MS. BONACCI: I am requesting information 14 in regards to how they have come to the --15 MR. SEYER: Ms. Bonnaci, could I ask you 16 to pause. I'm not sure why, but I've got 17 interference on my end. 18 Could you start again on what you were 19 saying? 20 MS. BONACCI: I have requested the 21 information for the addresses that they have -- are 2.2 saying that I owe these bills for that I had 23 utilities in my name. I have yet to receive those. 24 I still do not have a clear understanding in regards 25 to what all addresses are being charged to me and

1	the amounts. I'm not getting a whole lot of
2	cooperation.
3	MR. STEINER: This is Roger Steiner with
4	the company, and I believe you're talking about our
5	settlement discussions, which we'd be happy to
6	continue. We believe we have given you the
7	addresses. And I realize that you have requested
8	additional information, but we haven't been able to
9	quite determine what you're wanting. So we can do
10	that, you know, separate from this call, but that
11	would be something we would not do at this
12	procedural conference.
13	MS. BONACCI: Okay. Well, I just want the
14	record to reflect that I still have yet to clearly
15	understand what I'm being billed for.
16	MR. STEINER: And I understand. And I
17	believe we've given you two separate breakdowns of
18	that, and we will try again to break it down again.
19	But, Judge, we are trying to settle this
20	matter, and that's what that's what she's
21	referring to, I believe.
22	MR. SEYER: Okay.
23	MR. THOMPSON: Judge, I understand that
24	Ms. Bonacci has been seeking copies of tape
25	recordings having to do with her account and that

1 she has not received those. 2 MR. STEINER: I do not recall being asked 3 for tape recordings. 4 MR. SEYER: Tape recordings in the nature 5 of customer service calls? 6 MR. THOMPSON: I believe --7 If you're directing --MS. BONACCI: 8 MR. SEYER: That was directed to 9 Mr. Thompson. 10 MR. THOMPSON: Yes, Judge. I believe 11 that's the nature of it. 12 MR. SEYER: Is that correct, Ms. Bonacci? 13 Yes. That, and the actual MS. BONACCI: 14 recording that they supposedly have of me setting up 15 utilities at an address from seven years also. 16 MR. STEINER: Well -- I'm sorry. If you 17 requested tape recordings, I don't recall that. just recall you wanted to know if -- what the 18 19 charges were at the address and how the settlement 20 amount addressed that, and that's what we gave you. 21 If you asked -- I don't -- I'm not sure we have the 2.2 tape recordings, so I don't believe that's been 23 provided. 24 MS. BONACCI: That is partially the 25

request.

I mean, I do not do your billing. I show

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1	your billing as very hard to understanding, but
2	so for layman's terms, I had requested that each
3	individual address that I am being charged for be
4	listed accordingly, how much for that particular
5	address is being charged. I haven't received
6	anything that has stood close to that for me to be
7	able to determine what I'm being charged for, how
8	much for each of those addresses so I have a way to
9	defend against what you're claiming I owe.
LO	MR. THOMPSON: That's fine.
L1	MR. SEYER: Okay. And I understand that,
L2	Ms. Bonacci.
L3	So after this conference, hopefully you
L4	and the utility can get together and straighten that
L5	out.
L6	MS. BONACCI: Okay. Thank you.
L7	MR. SEYER: Uh-huh.
L8	The utility has filed its answer that
L9	the staff has filed a recommendation. Really,
20	there's and I do understand that there's
21	settlement negotiations going on, but at this point,
22	I do need to get this scheduled for an evidentiary
23	hearing, and so would it be possible, Mr. Thompson,
24	for you to get with the parties and file a proposed
25	procedural schedule on behalf of all the parties?



1	MR. THOMPSON: Absolutely, Judge. What
2	date would you like that?
3	MR. SEYER: You tell me, Mr. Thompson.
4	You've got a better grasp of how heavy your staff's
5	calendar is.
6	MR. THOMPSON: I'm going to be out of the
7	country for two weeks starting on the 16th, so if I
8	could give it to you at the end of the first week of
9	November, let's say the 3rd, I think that would work
LO	out.
L1	MR. SEYER: Yeah, that that would be
L2	fine.
L3	MR. THOMPSON: Okay. Thank you, Judge.
L4	MR. SEYER: And I would prefer that that
L5	procedural schedule include deadlines for prefiled
L6	testimony, if that is something that the parties are
L7	interested in or if or if they would prefer that
L8	all the testimony be presented at the hearing,
L9	that's something that you can let me know at that
20	time.
21	MR. THOMPSON: Yes, sir.
22	MR. SEYER: And have there has there
23	been any discussion as to where the actual hearing
24	would take place?
25	MR. THOMPSON: Not to my knowledge, sir.

1	MR. SEYER: Okay. Well, I know the
2	Commission rule speaks in terms of having the
3	hearing at the location of the complainant or within
4	30 miles of the complainant's residence, so I would
5	assume that would be the Kansas Cit we would use
6	the Kansas City office.
7	MR. THOMPSON: If that's acceptable to
8	staff.
9	MR. SEYER: I think everybody involved
LO	except myself and possibly a few staff witnesses
L1	would be located in Kansas City, so I would say when
L2	you put that procedural schedule that proposed
L3	procedural schedule together, you might check with
L4	availability for space there in the Kansas City
L5	office.
L6	MR. THOMPSON: Very well.
L7	MR. SEYER: All right. Are there are
L8	there any other issues that the parties want to take
L9	up today?
20	MR. STEINER: I don't think so, Judge.
21	MR. SEYER: All right. Hearing none,
22	then
23	MR. STEINER: Would it be okay after you
24	sign off and the court reporter signs off that I try
25	to understand from what the plaintiff's asking



1 for? I was not aware that tape recordings were 2 requested. I'm not actually sure they're available, 3 but could we use this to talk, or does this go away 4 after you sign off? 5 No. We -- we will -- we can MR. SEYER: 6 absolutely keep you both after I drop off and the 7 court reporter drops off. You're perfectly -- and 8 Emily in our office will -- will kind of pay 9 attention, and she has control over how long to --10 to let the meeting go on, so ... 11 MR. STEINER: Yes. 12 MR. SEYER: If you can either tell her or 13 send her a message that you're through, I would 14 appreciate that. 15 MR. STEINER: I will send an email to 16 Emily after we're done. 17 MR. SEYER: Okay. That sounds good. Well, then if there's nothing further --18 well, Ms. Bonacci, let me ask you really quickly. 19 20 Do you have any other questions of a procedural 21 nature? 22 MS. BONACCI: No. Not -- I mean, my 23 biggest concern is to understand what I'm defending 24 myself against. 25 MR. SEYER: I understand.

1	Page 11 MS. BONACCI: With that being said, I
2	that's it. Then I would have to address it
3	accordingly.
4	MR. SEYER: All right.
5	Then if there is nothing further, then
6	let's go off the record.
7	We'll adjourn the hearing and go off the
8	record.
