## ORDER GRANTING INTERVENTION

On April 17, 2020, The Empire District Electric Company, a Liberty Utilities company (Empire-Liberty) filed an application for approval of a Community Solar Pilot Program. The Commission directed notice of the application, and the Commission received an application to intervene from Renew Missouri on April 22, 2020.

Parties have ten days to respond to pleadings unless the Commission orders otherwise.<sup>1</sup> The Commission issued no order to the contrary, more than ten days have elapsed since Renew Missouri filed its application, and no party has objected. Thus, the Commission will take up the application to intervene unopposed.

The Commission finds that the interests of Renew Missouri differ from those of the general public and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing Renew Missouri to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The application to intervene filed by Renew Missouri is granted.
- 2. This order shall be effective when issued.
