**ORDER SETTING TIME FOR RESPONSE, ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE,
AND NOTICE THAT COMPLAINT MAY BE DISMISSED**

Issue Date: December 15, 2023

Effective Date: December 15, 2023

On October 30, 2023, Brett Felber and Lisa Lambert (jointly referred to as “Complainants”) filed a complaint against Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri. On November 2, 2023, the Commission issued a *Notice of Deficiency and Order Directing Filing* setting out deficiencies in the complaint and giving the Complainants notice that the Commission would take no action regarding this complaint until the deficiencies are corrected. The notice and order also indicated that the Commission may dismiss the complaint if the deficiencies were not cured by November 30, 2023.

On December 15, 2023, a filing was made which purported to be from both Complainants requesting that the complaint be dismissed. Commission rule 20 CSR 4240-2.116 states that “An applicant or complainant may voluntarily dismiss an application or complaint without an order of the commission at any time before prepared testimony has been filed or oral evidence has been offered by filing a notice of dismissal with the commission.” No testimony has been filed and no oral evidence has been offered in this case. However, the December 15th motion had only the typed names of the

Complainants and contained no signatures or other verification that both Complainants wish to dismiss their Complaint.

Thus the Commission will provide notice to the Complainants that unless the Commission receives a response from the Complainants stating that they do not intend to dismiss their Complaint, along with a good cause why the complaint should not be dismissed for failure to cure the original deficiencies, the Commission will dismiss this application for good cause pursuant to Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.116(4).

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. If Complainants wish to pursue this complaint, they shall file a responsive pleading stating they wish to pursue their complaint no later than December 26, 2023.
2. If Complainants wish to pursue this complaint, no later than December 26, 2023, they shall provide good cause why this complaint should not be dismissed for failure to cure the deficiencies.
3. If cause is not shown why the deficiencies in the complaint are not corrected, the Commission will dismiss this complaint.
4. This order shall be effective when issued.
