ORDER DIRECTING FILING

This case was opened on March 9, 2018, to consider The Empire District Electric Company's seventh fuel adjustment clause prudence review. On September 5, 2018, the Commission's Staff filed a report regarding its review in which it found no incidence or evidence of imprudence by Empire for the period of September 1, 2016, through February 28, 2018. On September 17, 2018, the Office of the Public Counsel filed a motion for evidentiary hearing in which it asserted that Empire had acted imprudently in its natural gas hedging purchasing policies. In raising this issue, Public Counsel was renewing its concerns about Empire's hedging policies that it had raised in Empire's previous prudence review, which was heard in File No. EO-2017-0065.

At that time, the Commission's finding of no imprudence in File No. EO-2017-0065 had been appealed to the Missouri Court of Appeals and was awaiting a decision by the court. Rather than proceed with the seventh prudence review while the sixth was under judicial review, the Commission issued a notice on October 4, 2018, indicating this matter would be held in abeyance pending judicial resolution of the prior case.

The Court of Appeals issued its Order on March 5, 2019, affirming the Commission's decision on the sixth prudence review. That Order became final and the Court's Mandate was issued on May 22, 2019.

With the Court of Appeal's decision having become final, this case is now ready to proceed. The Commission will direct the parties to consult each other and to file a recommendation regarding how the Commission should proceed to resolve this seventh prudence review. If they can agree upon a procedural schedule, the parties may file a joint recommendation. If they cannot reach agreement, the parties may file separate recommendations.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The parties shall file their recommendations regarding further proceedings no later than July 9, 2019.
 - 2. This order shall be effective when issued.
