SERVICE CONNECTION CHARGES

A. GENERAL

- 1. The term "Service Connection Charge" is used to define the non-refundable charge made for the establishment of a class of telephone service or subsequent additions to that service.
- 2. All changes in subscribers' equipment or service from one premise to another are treated as new service connections with Service Connection Charges applying.
- 3. Service Connection Charges are in addition to any other scheduled rates and charges normally applying under the tariffs. They apply in addition to and not in lieu of mileage charges, installation charges, or construction charges made because of unusual cost in establishing service.
- 4. Service Connection Charges are payable at the time application is made for the particular service or facility and prior to the establishment of service or upon presentation of a bill. Service may be established in advance of payment in the case of Service Connection Charges for additions to the service for departments, administrations, and agencies of the Federal, State, County, Township, or Municipal Governments.
- 5. Service Connection Charges do not apply to service re-established once, after the destruction or partial destruction of the customer's premises by means beyond the control of the customer, i.e., fire, flood or other acts of God, whether at the same or another location.
- 6. For customers displaced by the major flooding in the summer of 1993, Service Connection Charges do not apply to the establishment of service at an interim location or to the later re-establishment of service at the same or another location. This latter special flooding provision expires on December 31, 1993.

1.1 CLASS Features

CLASS (<u>Custom Local Area Signaling Services</u>) Features are a set of advanced call management features which will only be offered on one-party service and will not be activated on multi-party lines, certain FX lines and Payphone Services. CLASS Features may be offered in conjunction with *Enhanced Business Service (EBS) and consist of one or more of the following features:

A. Descriptions

1. Automatic Call Return:

Automatic Call Return permits the subscriber to place a call to the telephone number associated with the most recent incoming call whether or not the call was answered or the telephone number is known by the subscriber. If the called line is available, the call is immediately completed. If the called line is not available, a queuing process, which may last up to thirty minutes, takes place. When both lines are available, the calling subscriber is notified via a distinctive ring that the network is ready to place the call. When the subscriber picks up the telephone, the call is automatically placed.

2. Automatic Redial:

Automatic Redial allows the subscriber to automatically redial the last number dialed from the subscriber's telephone regardless of the completion status of the last number dialed. If the called line is available, the call will be placed immediately. If the redialed line is busy, the network will queue the request for thirty minutes and process the call when both the called and calling party lines are idle. When the call can be completed, a distinctive ring will be provided to the caller's line to alert the subscriber that the requested callback is ready. When the subscriber picks up the telephone, the call is automatically placed.

This feature cannot be activated for calls originating from a line that is forwarded.

* Enhanced Business Service (EBS), also known as Centrex Service, is a package of enhanced features offered to business customers with two or more touch tone access lines.

Caller ID by Number/Name Delivery Blocking allows the subscriber to prevent the delivery of the subscriber's directory number/name on a per call basis (per call block) or per line basis (per line block.) There is no charge for this service.

Per call block will block the delivery of the subscriber's number/name for one call only and may be activated by dialing an activation code (*67 from a touch tone telephone or 1167 from a rotary telephone) immediately prior to placing a call.

If the calling party activates Caller ID by Name/Number Delivery Blocking, the directory number/name will not be transmitted across the line. Instead, Caller ID by Number or Caller ID by Name and Number customers will receive an anonymous indicator. 6. Customer Originated Trace:

Customer Originated Trace enables the customer to initiate an automatic trace of the incoming call received, regardless of the time lapse since that call, provided there have been no intervening incoming or outgoing calls. To initiate the trace, the customer must dial an activation code, then dial a "1". Upon activation by the customer, the network automatically sends a message to the Telephone Company indicating the calling number, the time the call was received, and the time the trace was activated.

The customer using this feature would be required to contact the local telephone company business office for further action. The customer is not provided the traced number. The results of a successful trace will only be provided to legal authorities with proper authorization.

7. Distinctive Ringing:

Distinctive Ringing provides a distinctive ringing pattern to the subscribing customer for specific telephone numbers (a maximum of 12). The customer creates a screening list of telephone numbers through an interactive dialing sequence. When a call is received form one of the predetermined numbers; the customer is alerted with a distinctive ringing pattern. Calls form telephone numbers not included on the screening list will produce a normal ring.

If the called customer subscribes to Call Waiting (described in other sections of this tariff) and the call arrives while the line is busy, the Call Waiting tone has the same distinctive patterns. 811 Service

Section 1. Description

Issued: March 8, 2007

811 Service is a three-digit abbreviated local dialing arrangement which allows local exchange end-users to reach the providers of Missouri's One Call Notification System (811 Customer). 811 Service is used by the One Call Notification system to provide notice of excavation activities to operators of underground facilities. 811 Service determines the central office serving the calling party, translates the dialed digits to an 811 Customer provided designated toll free telephone number, and routes the call to that number.

- Section 2. Terms and Conditions
 - 2.0 The Company and the 811 Customer will negotiate the installation date for the 811 Service.
 - 2.1 There can be only one 811 Customer for each stand-alone, host, or remote central office NAP-NXX serving area.
 - 2.2 The Company will route calls based upon the serving central office.
 - 2.3 The 811 Customer must provide a toll-free number to the Company to ensure that toll charges are not incurred by the end-user. At all times it shall be the obligation of the 811 Customer to test and be aware of any translation errors or other mistakes in routing 811 calls to the customer provided toll free number.
 - 2.4 811 Service can only be accessed by end-users who subscribe to the Company's local exchange service. 811 Service will not complete calls dialed using 0 + 811 or 1 + 811. 811 calls are not permitted where local calling is restricted.
 - 2.5 811 Service does not include operator assisted calls, and will only be available to PBX, Centrex, and Key switching systems when those systems have been correctly programmed. The Company does not undertake to perform, nor shall it be responsible, for such programming.
 - 2.6 811 Service is provided as a community service. There will be no recurring or non-recurring charges for the service.

- Section 3. Limitation of Liability

 - 3.3 The Company will have no liability for any damages arising from damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing 811service.
 - 3.4 The Company's failure to provide or maintain service shall be excused by government orders, civil commotions, acts of God and other circumstances beyond the Company's reasonable control.
 - 3.5 The Company shall not be liable for any act or omission of any entity, and shall not be liable for any accident, injury to person or property, including death, libel, slander, infringement of intellectual property rights, nor shall the Company be responsible for any direct, indirect, incidental, special, consequential, exemplary, or punitive damages.
