These tariffs apply to the General Telephone Exchange Services of the Chariton Valley Telephone Corporation, hereinafter, referred to as the Telephone Company, in exchanges of the Telephone Company in Missouri. In the event of any conflict between any rate, rule or regulation contained in these General Exchange Service Tariffs and any rate, rule or regulation contained in the Local Exchange Service Tariffs, the rate, rule, or regulation contained in the Local Exchange Service Tariff shall apply.

The provision of services and facilities, as provided herein is subject to the General Rules and Regulations of the Telephone Company, which General Rules and Regulations as they now exist or as they may be revised, added to or supplemented by superseding issues are hereby made a part of these General Exchange Service Tariffs.

These Tariffs cancel and supersede all other Tariffs of the Telephone Company issued and effective prior to the effective date of these Tariffs.

GENERAL EXCHANGE SERVICE TARIFFS

SERVICE CONNECTION CHARGES

A. GENERAL

1. The term “Service Connection Charge” is used to define the non-refundable charge made for the establishment of a class of telephone service or subsequent additions to that service.
2. All changes in subscribers’ equipment or service from one premise to another are treated as new service connections with Service Connection Charges applying.
3. Service Connection Charges are in addition to any other scheduled rates and charges normally applying under the tariffs. They apply in addition to and not in lieu of mileage charges, installation charges, or construction charges made because of unusual cost in establishing service.
4. Service Connection Charges are payable at the time application is made for the particular service or facility and prior to the establishment of service or upon presentation of a bill. Service may be established in advance of payment in the case of Service Connection Charges for additions to the service for departments, administrations, and agencies of the Federal, State, County, Township, or Municipal Governments.
5. Service Connection Charges do not apply to service re-established once, after the destruction or partial destruction of the customer’s premises by means beyond the control of the customer, i.e., fire, flood or other acts of God, whether at the same or another location.
6. For customers displaced by the major flooding in the summer of 1993, Service Connection Charges do not apply to the establishment of service at an interim location or to the later re-establishment of service at the same or another location. This latter special flooding provision expires on December 31, 1993.

<p>A. GENERAL</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Private Coin Service is offered for use with a customer provided instrument-implemented coin telephone. Attachments of Private Coin Telephones to the network must be made pursuant to the rules and regulations set forth in this Tariff. Private Coin Service is a two-way or, optionally, one-way originating only business exchange access line composed of the serving central office line equipment with Selective Class of Call Screening treatment (where available), all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer's premises and the network interface. These facilities are Telephone Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for long distance service and local calling. Selective Class of Call Screening treatment enables the customer to restrict outgoing operator-handled calls from the service point to only those calls which are charged to a called telephone, a third number or a Calling Card account. In the case of one-way service, intercept treatment will be provided. A maximum of one customer-provided instrument-implemented coin telephone may be connected to any one Private Coin Service line. Selective Class of Call Screening must be provided wherever available. Any customer who offers Private Coin Service where Selective Class of Call Screening is not available, nonetheless assumes full and complete responsibility for all calls billed to his line. Section 2 of this Tariff, General Regulations, is applicable to the provision of Private Coin Service. Directory listings may be provided under the regulations governing the furnishing of listings for business subscribers.

- 9. For Private Coin Service, a network interface will be installed at a location determined by the Telephone Company which is accessible to the customer.
- (1) For purposes of this Tariff, the term "customer" is defined as the party who is responsible for payment of the Private Coin Service Exchange Access line.
- 10. The network interface is the point of connection with the telecommunications network and is the termination of the Private Coin Exchange Access Line. It is a Telephone Company-provided jack or its equivalent.
- 11. The maximum allowable charge for local calls on a customer-owned coin telephone shall be 25¢.

B. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CUSTOMER

- 1. The customer shall be responsible for the installation, operation and maintenance of the customer-provided instrument-implemented coin telephone used in connection with this service.
- 2. The customer shall be responsible for the payment of a Service Charge as provided in Section 5 of this Tariff for visits by a Telephone Company employee to the customer's premises when a service difficulty or trouble report results from the use of customer-provided instrument-implemented coin telephones, even if the service difficulty is reported by persons other than the customer.
- 3. The customer shall be responsible for the payment of charges for all local and toll messages originating from or accepted at this type of service, including any Directory Assistance Calls.
- 4. The customer-provided instrument-implemented coin telephones must be registered in compliance with Part 68 of the FCC's Registration Program or connected behind an FCC-registered coupler and have the following operational characteristics:
 - a. Must be able to access the Telephone Company operator at no charge and without using a coin.



DIRECTORY ASSISTANCE SERVICE

A. GENERAL

Directory Assistance service is defined as furnishing aid in obtaining telephone numbers. The Directory Assistance charges specified in this tariff apply when a customer within Missouri request the telephone numbers of other customers within the same LATA.

B. CONDITIONS

1. Rates specified in C.1. below are not applicable to:

-Calls placed from hotels and motels.

-Calls placed from hospitals.

-Calls placed from residence telephones where a member of the customer's household has been certified by a qualified authority as unable to use a directory or from the business telephone of a certified customer where other assistance is not available. A qualified authority is defined as including doctors of medicine, ophthalmologists, optometrists, registered nurses, therapists, professional staff of hospitals, institutions and public welfare agencies. Certification of physical disability sufficiently severe to prevent reading or using conventional reading or using conventional reading materials may also be made by professional librarians or by any person whose competence in this area is acceptable to the Librarian of Congress of the United States.

-Calls from certified exempt customers and charged to their Calling Card.



900 Blocking Service provides business and residence access line customers the ability to block access from a particular network access line to all telephone numbers for which the 900 NPA must be dialed.

B. CONDITIONS

1. 900 Blocking service is offered only to customers served by a central office equipped to provide this service.
2. 900 Blocking Service blocks access to all 900 telephone numbers from a particular network access line. It is not capable of blocking access to a specific 900 telephone number.
3. The minimum contract period for this service is one month.
4. Customers who wish to discontinue 900 blocking service must make their request in writing.

3. The service must be provided on all lines in a trunk or network access line group arranged for inward service. Routing of calls to selected numbers within the direct inward dialing number group over a separate trunk or network access line group is not contemplated.
4. The charges for the service, as provided in B. Rates following are in addition to all applicable charges for Local Business Service with which this service is associated and the applicable network access line and service charges.
5. Operational characteristics of interface signal between the Company-provided connecting arrangements and the customer-provided switching equipment must conform to the rules and regulations the Company considers necessary to maintain proper standards of service.

1.1 CLASS Features

CLASS (Custom Local Area Signaling Services) Features are a set of advanced call management features which will only be offered on one-party service and will not be activated on multi-party lines, certain FX lines and Payphone Services. CLASS Features may be offered in conjunction with *Enhanced Business Service (EBS) and consist of one or more of the following features:

A. Descriptions

1. Automatic Call Return:

Automatic Call Return permits the subscriber to place a call to the telephone number associated with the most recent incoming call whether or not the call was answered or the telephone number is known by the subscriber. If the called line is available, the call is immediately completed. If the called line is not available, a queuing process, which may last up to thirty minutes, takes place. When both lines are available, the calling subscriber is notified via a distinctive ring that the network is ready to place the call. When the subscriber picks up the telephone, the call is automatically placed.

2. Automatic Redial:

Automatic Redial allows the subscriber to automatically redial the last number dialed from the subscriber's telephone regardless of the completion status of the last number dialed. If the called line is available, the call will be placed immediately. If the redialed line is busy, the network will queue the request for thirty minutes and process the call when both the called and calling party lines are idle. When the call can be completed, a distinctive ring will be provided to the caller's line to alert the subscriber that the requested callback is ready. When the subscriber picks up the telephone, the call is automatically placed.

This feature cannot be activated for calls originating from a line that is forwarded.

* Enhanced Business Service (EBS), also known as Centrex Service, is a package of enhanced features offered to business customers with two or more touch tone access lines.

3. Caller ID by Number:

Caller ID by Number allows the subscriber, with the use of a display phone or adjunct display device, to view the directory number of an incoming call before answering. During the time that the incoming call is placed, the calling number is forwarded from the central office to a compatible customer provided Customer Premises Equipment (CPE) display unit associated with the customer's local exchange service. The calling telephone number is then delivered to the display unit during the first silent interval of ringing.

The calling number is not available when incoming calls have been handled by an operator or charged to credit cards. Number delivery for calls originating from a PBX will display the main PBX number only. If the caller's number is not part of the CLASS network, is a multi-party line, or is blocked, the number will not be displayed.

Caller ID by Number/Name Delivery Blocking allows the subscriber to prevent the delivery of the subscriber's directory number/name on a per call basis (per call block) or per line basis (per line block.) There is no charge for this service.

Per call block will block the delivery of the subscriber's number/name for one call only and may be activated by dialing an activation code (*67 from a touch tone telephone or 1167 from a rotary telephone) immediately prior to placing a call.

If the calling party activates Caller ID by Name/Number Delivery Blocking, the directory number/name will not be transmitted across the line. 6. Customer Originated Trace:

Customer Originated Trace enables the customer to initiate an automatic trace of the incoming call received, regardless of the time lapse since that call, provided there have been no intervening incoming or outgoing calls. To initiate the trace, the customer must dial an activation code, then dial a "1". Upon activation by the customer, the network automatically sends a message to the Telephone Company indicating the calling number, the time the call was received, and the time the trace was activated.

The customer using this feature would be required to contact the local telephone company business office for further action. The customer is not provided the traced number. The results of a successful trace will only be provided to legal authorities with proper authorization.

If the customer makes or receives another call before activating the trace, or if the Call Waiting feature (described in other sections of this tariff) is activated prior to activating the trace, the Customer Originated Trace will not record the correct number.

Customer Originated Trace will trace only those calls which are originated from a location served by the CLASS network. A separate charge applies to each successful activation of this feature.

7. Distinctive Ringing:

Distinctive Ringing provides a distinctive ringing pattern to the subscribing customer for specific telephone numbers (a maximum of 12). The customer creates a screening list of telephone numbers through an interactive dialing sequence. When a call is received from one of the predetermined numbers; the customer is alerted with a distinctive ringing pattern. Calls from telephone numbers not included on the screening list will produce a normal ring.

6. Customer Originated Trace will be billed the activation charge in addition to the monthly rate shown in the Rates and Charges section only when the attempt to trace and record the calling telephone number is successful. The results of a successful trace will only be provided to legal authorities with proper authorization. The Telephone Company will not be liable for damages if, for any reason, an attempt is not successful.

8. CLASS features will only be offered with one-party service, compatible PBX equipment and EBS. 9. CLASS features will only be offered in exchanges which meet the necessary technical specifications. In addition, the Company reserves the right to offer CLASS only where technologically feasible.

C. Non-chargeable CLASS Features:

1. Calling Number Delivery Blocking - Per Call: temporarily allows the subscriber, when placing outgoing calls, to label his or her telephone number as private, thus restricting its availability to the called party. 811 Service

Section 1. Description

811 Service is a three-digit abbreviated local dialing arrangement which allows local exchange end-users to reach the providers of Missouri's One Call Notification System (811 Customer). 811 Service is used by the One Call Notification system to provide notice of excavation activities to operators of underground facilities. 811 Service determines the central office serving the calling party, translates the dialed digits to an 811 Customer provided designated toll free telephone number, and routes the call to that number.

Section 2. Terms and Conditions

- 2.0 The Company and the 811 Customer will negotiate the installation date for the 811 Service.
- 2.1 There can be only one 811 Customer for each stand-alone, host, or remote central office NAP-NXX serving area.
- 2.2 The Company will route calls based upon the serving central office.
- 2.3 The 811 Customer must provide a toll-free number to the Company to ensure that toll charges are not incurred by the end-user. At all times it shall be the obligation of the 811 Customer to test and be aware of any translation errors or other mistakes in routing 811 calls to the customer provided toll free number.
- 2.4 811 Service can only be accessed by end-users who subscribe to the Company's local exchange service. 811 Service will not complete calls dialed using 0 + 811 or 1 + 811. 811 calls are not permitted where local calling is restricted.
- 2.5 811 Service does not include operator assisted calls, and will only be available to PBX, Centrex, and Key switching systems when those systems have been correctly programmed. The Company does not undertake to perform, nor shall it be responsible, for such programming.
- 2.6 811 Service is provided as a community service. There will be no recurring or non-recurring charges for the service.

811 Service, continued

Section 3. Limitation of Liability

- 3.0 811 Service is provisioned solely for the benefit of the 811 Customer. The provision of such service shall not be interpreted, construed, or regarded as being for the benefit of or creating any obligation toward, or any right of action on behalf of, any third person or other legal entity, including but not limited to end-users of the Company or any other providers of telecommunications service.
- 3.1 The Company will make commercially reasonable efforts to route 811 calls to the toll-free number provided by the 811 Customer, however the Company will not be responsible, or held responsible, for routing mistakes and errors, interruptions of service, or intervening Acts of God or other acts that interfere with telephone service and/or routing. The Company's obligation under this 811 Service applies solely to the transmission of the call to the toll-free number provided, and ends upon translation of an 811 call to the Customer provided toll free number.
- 3.2 The Company does not undertake to transmit messages under the terms of 811 service.
- 3.3 The Company will have no liability for any damages arising from damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission occurring in the course of furnishing 811 service.
- 3.4 The Company's failure to provide or maintain service shall be excused by government orders, civil commotions, acts of God and other circumstances beyond the Company's reasonable control.
- 3.5 The Company shall not be liable for any act or omission of any entity, and shall not be liable for any accident, injury to person or property, including death, libel, slander, infringement of intellectual property rights, nor shall the Company be responsible for any direct, indirect, incidental, special, consequential, exemplary, or punitive damages.
- 3.6 The 811 Customer shall defend the Company at the 811 Customer's expense, indemnify , and hold the Company harmless against any and all loss, claims, suits, or other action, or any liability whatsoever, whether suffered, made, instituted or asserted against the Company as directly or indirectly arising from the provision of 811 Service.
