ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO RESPOND TO APPLICATIONS TO INTERVENE AND EXTENDING TIME TO RESPOND TO PREVIOUS SUBMISSIONS

The Commission opened this file as a working case to facilitate Staff's investigation of the self-commit and self-scheduling practices of Missouri's investor-owned electric utilities in their respective RTO energy markets. The Commission's order opening this file directed the investor-owned electric utilities to provide certain generation and selfcommitment data to the Commission's Staff by July 8, 2019. The Commission allowed for responses and further submissions to be made by any stakeholder by July 17.

Some of the responses filed by the investor-owned electric utilities were filed as confidential, meaning non-parties to this case are unable to view the confidential data and thus are unable to fully respond. In order to view the confidential data, three stakeholders have applied to intervene: Renew Missouri Advocates, d/b/a Renew Missouri on July 8; The Missouri Department of Economic Development – Division of Energy on July 15; and the Natural Resources Defense Council on July 16. The Commission will shorten the time allowed to respond to those applications to intervene so that the Commission will be able to rule on those applications in time to allow those stakeholders an opportunity to view the confidential data before filing a response.

For the same reason, the Commission will extend the time established responding to the July 8 responses from July 17 to July 23.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Any stakeholder wishing to respond to the applications to intervene filed by Renew Missouri Advocates, d/b/a Renew Missouri; The Missouri Department of Economic Development – Division of Energy; and the Natural Resources Defense Council shall do so no later than July 17, 2019.

2. Any stakeholder may review the July 8, 2019 submissions and may respond to those submissions, or provide additional related materials by July 23, 2019, rather than July 17, 2019.

3. This order shall be effective when issued.
