**APPLICATION OF THE MISSOURI PURCHASING RESOURCE CENTER-  
ENERGY CONSORTIUM  
TO INTERVENE IN SUPPORT OF TARIFFS**

Comes now Missouri Purchasing Resource Center - Energy Consortium ("MOPRC-EC"), in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075, and, as its application to intervene in support of tariffs, states to the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") as follows:

1. MOPRC-EC is an energy purchasing group for members of the Missouri School Boards Association ("MSBA") and the Cooperating School Districts of St. Louis ("CSD"). The MSBA is made up of public school districts from all areas of the State of Missouri.<sup>1</sup> The CSD is CSD is made up of school districts in the metropolitan St. Louis area.<sup>2</sup>
2. Most MOPRC-EC member school districts have several buildings, which individually consume relatively small volumes of natural gas, but collectively use significant amounts of energy. Unlike a large consumer with natural gas consumption through one meter, most school facilities with equal or larger aggregate consumption do not currently have a viable option of choosing a supplier under a utility transportation tariff. Few school districts have energy experts on staff to manage natural gas purchasing. Nor do they individually have the size to fully benefit from economies of scale. MOPRC-EC's mission is to lower energy cost for all consortium members through choice

of a reliable, competitive supplier and through economies of joint administration. Every dollar saved on natural gas is an extra dollar that can be spent on students, instructional programs, facility improvements, staff development or new technology.

3. As an organization of school districts, MOPRC-EC's interest in this case is different than that of the general public. Granting MOPRC-EC's proposed intervention would serve the public interest by assisting the development of a more complete record for decision by the Commission.

4. MOPRC-EC has been fortunate to have had the opportunity to work closely with MPS and the Commission Staff ("Staff") in the development of several aspects of the proposed experimental small volume aggregation program.

5. MOPRC-EC believes effective ways can be developed to provide small consumers with a viable choice of suppliers under a small volume transportation program. One such way is to experiment with an aggregation transport service program. Schools in Kansas, Illinois, Iowa and Wisconsin have successful energy aggregation programs. The proposed MPS tariffs are similar to those UtiliCorp small volume aggregation tariffs in Kansas and Iowa.

6. MOPRC-EC is ideally suited to participate in the MPS pilot program. Its members are in the business of public education and will share pilot results, thereby benefitting all small consumers, natural gas marketers, utilities and regulators in developing a universally available small volume transport program. Member institutions provide broad experience by being geographically dispersed across the MPS service area and across the interstate pipelines and various operating and market zones. The program would also generally provide experience on the matters of pricing and assignment of pipeline capacity for potential future tariff revisions.


7. The start of the school calendar is just around the corner and the winter heating season

starts shortly thereafter. Early approval is critical to allow time for the enrollment of participants and arrangements for initial deliveries of natural gas under the experimental program. Thus, MOPRC-EC requests that the Commission approve the experimental small volume aggregation program tariffs with an effective date of September 1, 2000.

WHEREFORE, MOPRC-EC requests a Commission order:

- a) granting MOPRC's application to intervene and making it a party to this case for all purposes;
- b) approving MPS's tariffs designed to establish an experimental small volume aggregation program with a September 1, 2000 effective date; and,
- c) granting such further relief as may be necessary which is consistent with the relief requested herein.
