PROTECTIVE ORDER AND NOTICE THAT ADDITIONAL FILES HAVE BEEN OPENED

The Commission opened this file as a working case to facilitate Staff's investigation of the self-commit and self scheduling practices of Missouri's investor-owned electric utilities in their respective RTO energy markets. Staff has been directed to file a report regarding its investigation by August 23, 2019. On August 12, Staff filed a motion asking the Commission to open four new files, one for each of the investor-owned electric utilities, and to issue a protective order in each new file.

Staff explains that in the course of its investigation it has obtained market specific information from each of the electric utilities that should be treated as highly confidential pursuant to the Commission's confidential information rule, 4 CSR 240-2.135(4). Staff intends to refer to that highly confidential information in its report regarding each utility, but market specific information cannot be shared with the other electric utilities. To avoid the confidentiality problem, Staff asks the Commission to open new investigative files for each of the electric utilities. Staff proposes to submit the general elements of its report in this file. It proposes to file its report containing the company-specific confidential and highly-confidential information in the new files established for the specific electric utilities.

The following new files have been established regarding each electric utility:

EW-2020-0032 – Ameren Missouri;

EW-2020-0033 - Kansas City Power & Light Company;

EW-2020-0034 - KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company; and

EW-2020-0035 - The Empire District Electric Company.

In addition to the protective order in this file, the Commission will issue separate protective orders in each of those files. The non-utility parties in this file will be made parties in each of those files so there is no need for any of those parties to apply to intervene in the new files. Each electric utility will be made a party in its own file so it will be able to view the confidential and highly confidential information in the Staff report filed in that file.

The specific extra protections to be afforded to the information designated as highly confidential are described in this order.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Competitively sensitive information designated by Staff as highly confidential, based on the recommendation of the electric utility that provided that information to Staff, shall be disclosed only to attorneys of record for all parties, to state agency parties and their employees covered by statutory confidentiality requirements, and to designated outside experts of any non-state agency party.

2. Except for attorneys of record for all parties, and employees of state agency employees covered by statutory confidentiality requirements, all persons authorized to access “confidential” information in this case shall complete the nondisclosure agreement attached to this order as Exhibit A.

3. Except for attorneys of record for all parties, and employees of state agency employees covered by statutory confidentiality requirements, all persons authorized to access “highly confidential” information in this case shall complete the nondisclosure

agreement attached to this order as Exhibit B.

4. This order shall be effective when issued.

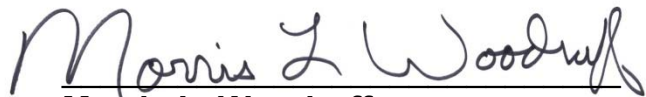
