On September 3, 2010, Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri, filed a tariff designed to increase its annual revenues for electric service. The Commission suspended that tariff and established September 27 as the deadline for interested parties to apply to intervene.

The Consumers Council of Missouri applied to intervene on September 24. The Consumers Council is a non-governmental, nonpartisan, nonprofit, membership organization that advocates for residential consumers. More than ten days have passed since the Consumers Council applied to intervene and no party has objected to that application.

The Commission finds that the interest of the Consumers Council in this case is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing the Consumer Council to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The Application to Intervene of the Consumers Council of Missouri is granted.
- 2. This order shall become effective on October 5, 2010.
