ORDER GRANTING THE LATE-FILED APPLICATION TO INTERVENE OF THE MISSOURI JOINT MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC UTILITY COMMISSION

On November 1, 2010, Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri, applied to the Commission to extend its authority to continue the transfer of functional control of its electric transmission system to the Midwest Independent Transmission System Operator, Inc. (Midwest ISO) through December 31, 2013. The Commission provided notice of the filing and established November 24, 2010, as the deadline for interested parties to apply to intervene. The Missouri Joint Municipal Electric Utility Commission (MJMEUC) applied to intervene out of time on June 1, 2011.

MJMEUC is a political subdivision of the state that is organized to benefit the residents of its member municipalities. Some of those member municipalities are directly embedded in Ameren Missouri's transmission system. MJMEUC explains that it is now seeking to intervene in this case because Midwest ISO has recently proposed changes to the Resource Adequacy Requirements of its tariff. Those changes to the Midwest ISO tariff could affect MJMEUC's ability to transmit electricity to its members from its coal-fired generating plant in Illinois. Because of that transmission issue, MJMEUC now has an

interest in whether Ameren Missouri remains as a member of the Midwest ISO and for that reason seeks to intervene in this case.

More than ten days have passed since MJMECU applied to intervene and no party has objected to that application.

The Commission finds that the interest of MJMEUC in this case is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. In addition, the Commission finds that allowing MJMEUC to intervene will serve the public interest. Finally, the Commission finds that MJMEUC has shown good cause for its late intervention. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4) & (5), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Application to Intervene Out of Time of the Missouri Joint Municipal Electric Utility Commission is granted.

2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
