ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

Issue Date: April 3, 2024 Effective Date: April 3, 2024

On March 6, 2024,¹ Spire Missouri Inc. d/b/a Spire filed an application pursuant to Sections 393.1009 to 393.1015, RSMo,² and Commission Rules 20 CSR 4240-2.060, 2.080, and 3.265, requesting that the Commission authorize changes to Spire's transportation service tariff language for gas service.

The Commission directed notice and set a deadline of March 12 for applications to intervene. The Missouri School Boards' Association (MSBA) filed an application to intervene on March 19. MSBA's application states that allowing MSBA to intervene will serve the public interest, including numerous schools and school districts. MSBA also contends that its interests are different from the general public, due to this proceeding containing tariff provisions dealing with natural gas transportation service for schools, which must comply with Section 393.310 RSMo.

Intervention out of time may be granted upon a showing of good cause, as provided by Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075(10). The rule requires those who seek intervention after the intervention date to provide a "definitive statement" whether the

entity seeking intervention "accepts the record established in the case" as of the date of application.

MSBA asserts that it received notice of the case filing, but was unable to submit a timely application because the notice was not delivered to the appropriate person until after the intervention deadline. MSBA's application further states it accepts the record in this case as of the date of its application on March 19.

More than 10 days have passed since MSBA applied to intervene out of time; no party has objected to the application. The Commission will grant MSBA's application to intervene. The Commission finds good cause exists based on MSBA's representation that it filed an application as promptly as circumstances allowed. After considering the unopposed application to intervene, the Commission finds that MSBA has an interest which is different from that of the general public and allowing it to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075(3), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The application to intervene of the Missouri School Boards' Association is granted.
 - 2. This order is effective when issued.
