In addition, I would probably refrain from dismissing this matter, as my legal counsel filed a criminal complaint on Sunday April 28, 2024 with the Federal Bureau Of Investigation's IC3 cybercrimes and network department regarding Exhibit D the forgery document.

Thanks to the Commission, I have been forced to retain counsel outside this matter in seek prosecution of the individual parties who have infringed and allowed the forgery production to be utilzed and extort me out of \$\frac{1}{2}\

We have filed a criminal complaint through the IC3 against Eric Banks, Jermaine Grubbs, Terri Engelbrecht, Aubrey Krcmar, Jennifer Hernandez, Regulatory Judge John Clark, Commissioners Hahn, Rupp, Holsman, Kolkmeyer, Coleman, Sarah Fontaine and Contessa King for allowing the use and prodution of a counterfeit document and forgery document.

In addition, the FBI cybercrimes unit recommends that my legal counsel file a criminal complaint with the DA's Office, in addition to the complaint registered with the FBI.

I've been more than generous with Ameren Missouri and more importantly the Missouri Public Service Commission about the counterfeit document at question. I've been further lied to by their new undersigned counsel and more importantly the Commission. My patience has run out after almost a year of genrousity and more importantly asking Ameren Missouri to admit the truth about the document.

Furthermore, I believe the Attorneys or prior attorney's involved in crafting this document should be held to a hire or sterner prosecution, as they used a counterfeit or forger document to extort me out of funds and defraud me out of additional funds.

I also have no desire to dismiss any criminal complaints filed against any of the individual parties until Ameren Missouri returns the they owe me and admit the counterfeit document.

The Missouri Public Service Commission employees a bunch of fraudsters and Ameren Missouri employees fraudsters too. This is not a route I wanted to engage in, but after further talks, it is the best recourse of action to take.
