ORDER SETTING TIME FOR OBJECTIONS

On May 6, 2020, Evergy Metro Inc. d/b/a Evergy Missouri Metro and Evergy Missouri West, Inc. d/b/a Evergy Missouri West (collectively “Evergy”) applied for an accounting authority order to govern costs and financial impacts associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

On October 8, 2020, some of the parties filed a *Non-unanimous Stipulation and Agreement* proposing to resolve the case. The signatories to the agreement are Evergy, the Staff of the Commission, Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers, Midwest Energy Consumers Group, and Sierra Club. Three other parties, Missouri-American Water Company, Spire Missouri, and Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri, are not signatories to the agreement. However, the agreement indicates those three parties do not object to the agreement and will not request a hearing. No representation is made as to the position of the remaining parties.

After the filing of a stipulation and agreement entered into by fewer than all of the parties, Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.115(2)(B),(C) provides parties seven days to

file objections. Failure to file a timely objection waives any right to hearing. If no timely objections are filed, the Commission may treat such an agreement as unanimous.

The Commission will order the filing of any objections, as provided by rule.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Any objection to the *Non-unanimous Stipulation and Agreement* shall be filed no later than October 15, 2020.
2. This order shall be effective when issued.
