



#### Working with Customers in Rural Communities

**Economic Development Rider** - 5-year discounted rate for new or expanding non-retail customers.

- 200/300 KW/Multiple shifts
- Incentives
- Additional year for rural areas with stranded infrastructure

Revenue Justification - Buy down the cost of needed infrastructure upgrades based on projected new revenue

#### Working with Rural Communities

We team with **local and regional partners** located in **Evergy's** service area to offer tools that help ensure economic development success and strengthen your community.











The Evergy Economic Development team in partnership with the Johnson County Missouri Economic Development Corporation (JCEDC) were able to put the Local Partner Program to work for the City of Warrensburg to help land a \$110M Dollar Tree distribution facility.

The 1.2 million square-foot distribution facility is the first tenant to occupy Brady Commerce Park on Highway 13.













Laying the groundwork incorporated the EDC's collaboration with Evergy, which included:

Provided funding for the **50 Highway Corridor Study**, which resulted in the need for **new industrial sites**

Utilized Evergy Revenue Justification to help offset cost of needed infrastructure



Secured an **Economic Development** Rider for Dollar Tree



MEEIA new construction lighting project last year and into early 2019 that totaled over 6.6 million kWh in savings (and about 680 kW in demand)











- 150–200 inbound/outbound trucks per day
- 375 new jobs within three years
- Adjacent land available ready for future development
