1 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Good morning. We are on  
2 the record. These are the prehearing conferences in  
3 Case Nos. ER-2010-0355 and 0356. I'm Ron Pridgin. I  
4 am the Regulatory Law Judge assigned to preside over  
5 these prehearing conferences.

6 Judge Dippell is the judge over 0356.  
7 She is out of town and has asked me to run the  
8 prehearing conference. And we decided it would be  
9 better to consolidate them anyway since there's so  
10 much in common, so many parties common in both of  
11 these cases.

12 Conferences are being held on July 6th,  
13 2010 at approximately 10:00 a.m. We're in the  
14 Governor Office Building in Jefferson City, Missouri  
15 and we also have some folks participating by  
16 telephone.

17 I would like to get entries of appearance  
18 from counsel. I have endeavored to get everyone  
19 listed who is either an intervenor because of the  
20 experimental regulatory plan case in EO-2005-0329 or  
21 who has applied to intervene in either of these cases.  
22 So I'll try to go through those one by one and then I  
23 will ask to see if I have missed anyone at the end.

24 So if I could get entries of appearance  
25 from counsel on behalf of Kansas City Power & Light

1 and KCP&L GMO, please.

2 MR. FISCHER: Thank you, Judge. Let the  
3 record reflect the appearance of Roger Steiner and  
4 James M. Fischer on behalf of the companies in these  
5 cases. Our contact information is listed on our  
6 written entries of appearance. I might mention that  
7 Mr. Steiner is now serving as in-house counsel for the  
8 companies, in contrast to his previous role.

9 JUDGE PRIDGIN: And, Mr. Fischer, thank  
10 you.

11 On behalf of the Staff of the Commission,  
12 please.

13 MR. DOTTHEIM: On behalf of the Staff of  
14 the Missouri Public Service Commission, Steven  
15 Dottheim, Kevin Thomas -- Thompson --

16 MR. PORTER: Mister Administrative Law  
17 Judge, this is Steve Porter in Washington, DC. I hate  
18 to interrupt the proceedings, but I'd like to let you  
19 know that we're having a little trouble hearing and  
20 it's going in and out and the volume is low as well.

21 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Thank you. I  
22 apologize for that. Can I ask everyone to turn their  
23 microphone on, please.

24 MR. FISCHER: Judge, I'm not sure this  
25 mic is working. Can you hear me through the

1 microphone?

2 JUDGE PRIDGIN: I'm seeing a bunch of  
3 nods of people that are saying no so --

4 MR. LOWERY: This one's on and it's  
5 not --

6 JUDGE PRIDGIN: We've got some dead mics.

7 MR. CONRAD: The lights are green, but --

8 JUDGE PRIDGIN: I believe -- I don't even  
9 think -- are the mics working out here? I tend to  
10 yell, so -- okay. For reasons I don't understand -- I  
11 apologize. I'll just ask everyone to try to project  
12 as best you can.

13 And I will go off the record here pretty  
14 shortly and allow people to kind of congregate and  
15 work out how to -- how to deal with this. And I'll  
16 also try to deal with the microphone problem once we  
17 get entries of appearance. And I apologize. I mean,  
18 it looks like I've got a hot mic up here that's not  
19 working so I will work on that here shortly. I'm very  
20 sorry.

21 MR. PORTER: Sir, we can hear you very  
22 well. Perhaps if you could just repeat the names as  
23 they report in, that would be helpful to us.

24 JUDGE PRIDGIN: I'll certainly try. I've  
25 got a long list of some of them. Mr. Fischer entered

1 an appearance for himself and Mr. Steiner on behalf of  
2 the companies. And Mr. Dottheim for Staff is entering  
3 an appearance for himself and for others for the staff  
4 of the commission. will that suffice?

5 MR. PORTER: Yes. Thank you very much.

6 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Thank you. And,  
7 Mr. Dottheim, I'm sorry for the interruption. If you  
8 wanted to continue.

9 MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes. I think maybe I'd  
10 mentioned Kevin Thompson, Nathan Williams, Eric  
11 Dearmont, Jamie Ott and Sarah Kliethermes. And of  
12 course, our address is Post Office Box 360, Jefferson  
13 City, Missouri 65102.

14 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Mr. Dottheim,  
15 thank you.

16 And I apologize. I'll try my best to  
17 translate for those on the phone. On behalf of the  
18 office of the Public Counsel, please.

19 MR. MILLS: On behalf of the office of  
20 the Public Counsel and the public, my name is Lewis  
21 Mills. My address is Post Office Box 2230, Jefferson  
22 City, Missouri 65102.

23 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Mills, thank you.  
24 Lewis Mills has entered his appearance on behalf of  
25 the Office of the Public Counsel.



1 On behalf of the Missouri Department of  
2 Natural Resources, please.

3 MS. MANGELSDORF: Sarah Mangelsdorf for  
4 the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, PO Box  
5 899, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.

6 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Thank you.  
7 Ms. Mangelsdorf has entered her appearance on behalf  
8 of the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.

9 On behalf of Praxair, Incorporated,  
10 please.

11 MR. CONRAD: Your Honor, I'll do this  
12 twice. For the benefit of the parties in Washington,  
13 I'm going to use English now. Praxair, Inc. is a  
14 automatic party pursuant to the regulatory plan. And  
15 on behalf of that party, please show the appearance of  
16 Stuart W. Conrad and David L. Woodsmall of the law  
17 firm of Finnegan, Conrad and Peterson. Main office is  
18 3100 Broadway, Suite 1209, Kansas City, Missouri;  
19 Jefferson City office is 428 East Capitol, Suite 300,  
20 Jefferson City, Missouri 65101.

21 Also on behalf -- and, Judge, I'm  
22 presuming you're taking appearances in the 0355 matter  
23 at this point?

24 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Well, really in either.  
25 I'm going to go through both.

1 MR. CONRAD: In the 355 matter, the same  
2 attorneys and the same law firm on behalf of the  
3 separate intervention of the Midwest Energy Users'  
4 Association, MEUA.

5 Now, in the 356 matter, ER-2010-0356,  
6 same attorneys and offices on behalf of Ag Processing,  
7 Inc. And also same attorneys and offices on behalf of  
8 the Sedalia Industrial Energy Users' Association. And  
9 I realize that I'm out of your order and I apologize,  
10 but I thought it would be simpler to take all of that  
11 together.

12 JUDGE PRIDGIN: No, that makes sense to  
13 me and I appreciate that.

14 MR. CONRAD: Thank you.

15 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Stu Conrad has entered  
16 his appearance and the appearance of David Woodsmall  
17 on behalf of Praxair, Incorporated, on behalf of  
18 Midwest Energy Users' Association, on behalf of Ag  
19 Processing and on behalf of Sedalia Industrial Energy  
20 Users' Association. And Mr. Conrad, thank you.

21 On behalf of Missouri Industrial Energy  
22 Consumers, please.

23 MS. VUYLSTEKE: For the Missouri  
24 Industrial Energy Consumers, Diana Vuylsteke of the  
25 law firm Bryan Cave, 211 North Broadway, Suite 3600,

1 St. Louis, Missouri 63102.

2 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Ms. Vuylsteke, thank you.  
3 Diana Vuylsteke has entered her appearance on behalf  
4 of Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers.

5 On behalf of Ford Motor Company, please.

6 MS. VUYLSTEKE: I apologize, your Honor.  
7 Also, once again, Diana Vuylsteke, Bryan Cave, 211  
8 North Broadway, Suite 3600, St. Louis 63102.

9 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Thank you. Ms. Vuylsteke  
10 has also entered on behalf of Ford Motor Company.

11 On behalf of the Empire District Electric  
12 Company, please.

13 MR. SWEARENGEN: Jim Swearngen, Diana  
14 Carter and Russ Mitten for Empire. I've made a  
15 written entry.

16 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Swearngen, thank  
17 you. Mr. Swearngen has entered his appearance, the  
18 appearance of Ms. Carter, Diana Carter, and I'm sorry  
19 Russ Mitten; is that correct --

20 MR. SWEARENGEN: Yes.

21 JUDGE PRIDGIN: -- on behalf of Empire  
22 District Electric Company?

23 On behalf of Missouri Joint Municipal  
24 Electric Utility Commission, please. I hear no  
25 appearance for them.

1 On behalf of the City of Kansas City  
2 Missouri, please. Hear no appearance for the City of  
3 Kansas City.

4 On behalf of AmerenUE, please.

5 MR. LOWERY: Your Honor, Jim Lowery;  
6 Smith, Lewis, LLP, PO Box 918, Columbia Missouri 65205  
7 on behalf of Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE.

8 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Lowry, thank you.  
9 James Lowry has entered his appearance on behalf of  
10 AmerenUE.

11 On behalf of Missouri Gas Energy, please.

12 MR. MCCARTNEY: Brian McCartney, Dean  
13 Cooper and Todd Jacobs. I've entered a written entry  
14 of appearance.

15 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Bear with we. I'm sorry.  
16 Brian McCartney has entered his appearance on behalf  
17 of Missouri Gas Energy and also the appearance of Todd  
18 Jacobs -- and I missed one, I'm sorry.

19 MR. MCCARTNEY: Dean Cooper.

20 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Dean Cooper as well.  
21 Thank you.

22 On behalf of I believe a group known as  
23 Hospital Intervenors. I hear no appearance for  
24 Hospital Intervenors.

25 On behalf of the US Department of Energy,

1 please?

2 Yes, thank you. This is Steve Porter and  
3 Perry Bruder on behalf of the Department of Energy,  
4 NNSA and the federal executive agencies.

5 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Mr. Porter,  
6 thank you. I have Mr. Porter's appearance and  
7 Mr. Bruder's appearance on behalf of those federal  
8 agencies.

9 I have an application to intervene from a  
10 Robert Wagner. I hear no entry for him.

11 On behalf of AARP?

12 MR. COFFMAN: Your Honor, I'm appearing  
13 in both cases on behalf of two non-profit  
14 organizations that have applied to intervene; AARP, as  
15 well as the Consumers Council of Missouri. My address  
16 is 871 Tuxedo Boulevard, St. Louis, Missouri 63119.

17 JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Thank you.  
18 John Coffman has entered his appearance on behalf of  
19 AARP and Consumers Council of Missouri. Thank you.

20 On behalf of Dogwood Energy, please.

21 MR. LUMLEY: Thank you, Judge. On the  
22 telephone, this is Carl Lumley appearing in the NEMO  
23 case, the 356 case, on behalf of Dogwood Energy, LLC.  
24 My address is 130 South Bemiston, suite 200,  
25 St. Louis, Missouri 63105.

1 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Lumley, thank you.

2 Carl Lumley has entered an appearance on behalf

3 Dogwood Energy, LLC.

4 who do I have left? City of Lee's

5 Summit, Missouri, please.

6 MS. WILLIAMS: Yes. On the telephone,

7 Teresa Williams representing City of Lee's Summit.

8 220 Southeast Green Street, Lee's Summit, Missouri

9 64063.

10 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Teresa Williams has

11 entered her appearance on behalf of the City of Lee's

12 Summit. Thank you.

13 On behalf of Liberty Hospital, please.

14 No appearance for Liberty Hospital.

15 On behalf of North Kansas City Hospital,

16 please. No appearance for North Kansas City.

17 Bear with me, please. On behalf of the

18 City of St. Joseph, Missouri, please.

19 MR. STEINMEIER: Thank you, your Honor.

20 Please let the record reflect the appearance of

21 William D. Steinmeier; William D. Steinmeier, PC, PO

22 Box 104595 in Jefferson City, Missouri on behalf of

23 the City of St. Joseph, Missouri.

24 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Steinmeier, thank

25 you. William Steinmeier has entered his appearance on

1 behalf of the City of St. Joseph.

2           On behalf of Missouri Retailers  
3 Association, please. No appearance for Missouri  
4 Retailers Association.

5           And I believe that is all that I have.  
6 who have I missed?

7           CAPTAIN MCNEILL: Sir, this is Captain  
8 Shayla McNeill filing an appearance in the ER-356 case  
9 on behalf of the federal executive agencies,  
10 specifically Whiteman Air Force Base.

11           JUDGE PRIDGIN: Okay. I'm sorry. I did  
12 not get your name.

13           CAPTAIN MCNEILL: Captain Shayla McNeill,  
14 S-h-a-y-l-a.

15           JUDGE PRIDGIN: Thank you, Ms. McNeill.  
16 I'm sorry. I recognize your name now. Sorry. Thank  
17 you.

18           Have I missed anyone else?

19           All right. Hearing none, I think in my  
20 case -- I don't want to speak for Judge Dippell and  
21 the parties made need to educate me on that. In the  
22 0355 case, I have I think required a proposed  
23 procedural schedule from the parties in two weeks  
24 rather than in the normal one week and I did that with  
25 the thought that we've got some pending applications

1 to intervene and it might be awkward and -- and force  
2 the parties to ask for an extension of time and we  
3 don't necessarily know who the parties are. So I've  
4 given you an extra week to allow the Commission to  
5 rule on applications to intervene. So I believe that  
6 is the parties' next deadline in this case.

7           And I don't know if the deadline is the  
8 same for 0356 or if it's different. And I don't know  
9 if the parties care to state on the record if they  
10 know or not. And if you don't know, that's fine.  
11 That's what's going on with mine. Normally I would --  
12 I would say, Okay, I'll hear from you in a week, but  
13 that's not the case in mine. A proposed procedural  
14 schedule would be due in two weeks instead and the  
15 reason is there's pending applications to intervene.

16           Is there anything that the parties need  
17 from me? Again, if it's about the 0356 case, I may  
18 not have much information, but I'll do my best. Now,  
19 do the parties have any questions or concerns to bring  
20 to my attention before I go off the record?

21           All right. Hearing none, you have -- I'm  
22 sorry, Mr. Conrad.

23           MR. CONRAD: One question, Judge.

24           JUDGE PRIDGIN: Yes, sir.

25           MR. CONRAD: I think you had indicated



1 early on that in the two cases, your Honor would be  
2 doing the 0355 case and Judge Dippell would be doing  
3 the 0356 case.

4 JUDGE PRIDGIN: That's my understanding.

5 MR. CONRAD: Okay. Any other law judges  
6 assigned as far as you're aware at this point?

7 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Not as far as I'm aware.

8 MR. CONRAD: Thank you.

9 JUDGE PRIDGIN: You're welcome. And,  
10 Mr. Conrad -- if you couldn't hear on the phone -- he  
11 simply asked the assignments of these cases. I'm Ron  
12 Pridgin, I'm assigned to the 0355 case, what I would  
13 call the KCP&L case; and Judge Dippell is assigned to  
14 the 0356 case, which I would call the GMO case. And  
15 that was Mr. Conrad's question.

16 Is there anything else from the parties?  
17 Mr. Fischer?

18 MR. FISCHER: Yes, Judge. Is it possible  
19 that we could get some technical assistance on getting  
20 our microphones fixed so the folks on the phone could  
21 hear our discussion about the procedural schedule?

22 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Yes, sir. Mr. Fischer  
23 just asked -- and that's one reason why I'm trying to  
24 wrap my portion up. Mr. Fischer just asked if we  
25 could get some assistance with the microphones. I'm

1 not sure why they're not working. And so what I hope  
2 to do is go off the record and try to get some help to  
3 get the microphones going so everybody can hear each  
4 other better.

5 MR. FISCHER: Thank you.

6 JUDGE PRIDGIN: You're welcome, sir. I  
7 apologize.

8 I'm sorry, Mr. Dottheim?

9 MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes. I don't know if  
10 somebody just joined us on the line. I don't know if  
11 it might be another party.

12 JUDGE PRIDGIN: I did hear a beep,  
13 Mr. Dottheim. Thank you. Is there anyone who just  
14 joined the phone bridge recently? Okay. I'm not  
15 hearing anything.

16 All right. Obviously I'm up on the ninth  
17 floor, as is the hearing calender, if you need me or  
18 if you need that calendar and you have access to this  
19 room the rest of the day. Is there anything else I  
20 can do for the parties before we go off the record?

21 All right. Hearing nothing, that will  
22 conclude the on-the-record portion of the prehearing  
23 conferences in Cases Number ER-2010-0335 and 0356. If  
24 everyone on the phone would please stay on the line,  
25 I'll go off the record, I'll leave and then I'll try

1 to get some help with the microphones. All right.

2 thank you very much. We're off the record.
