4	THE COURT: Good afternoon. We are on-the-record.
5	This is a virtual local public hearing for the Evergy rate
6	case, file No. ER-2024-0189. It is being held at noon on
7	August 1, 2024. The Missouri Public Service Commission has set
8	this time for a local public hearing to give members of the
9	public a chance to comment about Evergy West's general rate
10	increase application.
11	The commission regulates the rates charge by public
12	utility companies in Missouri to ensure that those rates
13	are just and reasonable. The commission also regulates
14	the quality of service and safety of the operations of
15	public utilities. My name is Ron Pridgin. I am the
16	regulatory law judge presiding over this hearing. The
17	commissioners have not made any decisions in this case and
18	they cannot answer any questions because they need to wait
19	until all of the evidence has been presented.
20	Let me see if we have any entries of appearance from
21	counsel, beginning with Evergy please.
22	MR. STEINER: Yes. Can you hear me, Judge?
23	THE COURT: Yes, sir, I can.
24	MR. STEINER: My name is Roger Steiner. I am an
25	attorney for Evergy Missouri West. My address is 1200 Main

2	THE COURT: Mr. Steiner, thank you. Any entry on
3	behalf of the staff of commission please?
4	MR. PRINGLE: Yes, Judge. Thank you. Can you hear
5	me?

7	MR. PRINGLE: This is Travis Pringle appearing on

10	hearing or local public hearing that we've had in the
11	consecutive days. This is the first virtual one. We did have
12	some participants last night who felt like they wanted to have
13	more time. We offered to have them come in today so maybe
14	we'll hear from some of them. I also want to mention that
15	Sheriff Hahn is participating from the listening standpoint.
16	She's unable from a technical standpoint to contribute, so I
17	would just like to welcome everybody on behalf of the
18	commissioners to this local public hearing via WebEx. Thank
19	you.
20	THE COURT: Commissioner, thank you. Any further
21	opening remarks from commissioners?
22	Okay. Hearing none, we will then proceed to
23	testimony. And because I don't have any sort of sign-up
24	sheet, I guess I will just ask if anyone would like to
25	testify.

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1	Page5 MR. GLAUZ: Hello. My name is Bob Klaus. I'm a
2	resident of Lees Summit. And
3	THE COURT: Okay. If you'd like to testify, let me
4	swear you in and then ask you to spell your name for the court
5	reporter. And then I'm going to ask everyone to limit their
6	testimony to five minutes so everyone has plenty of time to
7	testify. So Mr. Glauz, if you'll raise your right hand to be
8	sworn please.
9	MR. GLAUZ: Yes.
10	[Witness sworn in.]
11	THE COURT: Thank you very much. If you'll state and
12	spell your name for the court reporter please.
13	MR. GLAUZ: Yes. My name is Robert Glauz, spelt
14	G-L-A-U-Z.
15	THE COURT: All right. And what is your testimony
16	for the commission please?
17	MR. GLAUZ: I just want to make some comments about
18	some observations from the Evergy 2023 annual report.
19	Specifically they show return on equity for Evergy this
20	segment, Missouri West and how it compared to other utility
21	companies in the S S&P 500. Over the last five years Evergy
22	has shot about a 2 percent return on equity whereas the average
23	for the S&P 500 Company is about a 7 percent return. The
24	increase that they are requesting is targeting a 10.5 percent
25	return on equity. And I know that some jurisdictions limit

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1	Page6 that return on equity or at least limit what they are striving
2	for, and I thought that the 10.5 was overreaching rather high
3	for a utility company.
4	That was the main point I wanted to make. I'm hoping
5	that that request will be assessed in a manner that would
6	preferably result in a lower return on equity in line with
7	other utility companies.
8	One other comment, this increase is going to be
9	hitting residential customers more than commercial
10	customers. And I understand that there's some process for
11	determining that, but as a residential customer, I'm not
12	too happy that we're catching more of the burden of this
13	increase. And that's all I have.
14	THE COURT: Mr. Glauz, thank you. Are there any
15	commissioner questions?
16	All right. Hearing none, Mr. Glauz, thank you for
17	your testimony. Is there anyone else who wishes to
18	testify? All right. Going once, going twice, I'll
19	I'll give up one last opportunity. Does anyone else wish
20	to make any testimony in todays local public hearing?
21	THE WITNESS: Yes, Your Honor.
22	THE COURT: Okay. I'm sorry. If you'll identify
23	yourself please.
24	MR. GREEN: Jesse Green.

8	comments last night there in Sedalia and just had a a quick
9	follow-up in the Q&A and touching base there. And it was
10	pretty obvious that what I spoke about last night with false
11	advertisement became very true whenever I learned in the Q&A
12	session from Evergy's spokesperson that the actual average bill
13	in Evergy Missouri West is \$126, so 26 26 percent higher
14	than their flyer put out. So when whenever we are talking
15	dollars to the consumer, I would assume that we would try to be
16	more accurate in the in the false advertisement, but it's
17	definitely something that has turned out to be something that
18	Evergy maybe would normally do. Thank you.
19	THE COURT: Thank you. Does the commission have any
20	questions?
21	All right. Hearing none. Mr. Green, thank you
22	again. Does anyone else
23	MR. GREEN: All right. Thanks.

24	that's being used and utilized like it should be. But I think
25	this 17 percent increase could be a lot less if they'd just let

3	some some fat that could be trimmed in other places I
4	believe. Thank you.
