SUGGESTED SPECIAL CONTEMPORARY ISSUES OF NRDC

Pursuant to 4 CSR 240-22.080(4), the Natural Resources Defense Council recommends the following as special contemporary resource planning issues for consideration and analysis by Empire.

- 1. In addition to the exercise prescribed in 4 CSR 240-22.045, Empire should analyze integrated distribution planning as a way to manage the distribution grid in a manner that reduces peaks and fills valleys in load profiles and lowers overall system costs with a combination of energy efficiency, demand response, electric vehicles, distributed generation, storage, advanced metering, and pricing strategies such as time-of-use rates (TOU) and inclining block rates (IBR).
- 2. Analyze and assess the use of mechanisms such as green tariffs and community solar to increase the availability of distributed generation for large and small customers.
- 3. Analyze and document the prospects for using securitization to advance the retirement of coal generation assets and channel the savings into more economical investments such as demand-side management, building wind and solar generation, and satisfying corporate renewable energy goals to attract new business to the service territory. Securitization is essentially a lower cost, long-term loan that ratepayers take out and pledge to repay using

a portion of their future electricity bills using a long-term, lower-cost bond that will save customers money, some of which can be used as new capital.

4. Analyze, document and screen the prompt retirement of the Asbury plant as a resource option.
