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JUDGE HATCHER: Good evening, everyone.

Our court reporter is online, so let's go ahead and go on the record. I have checked, and we have three of our commissioners on the Webex call and we have Commissioner Coleman with us. I'll get to their introductions in just a moment.

The Missouri Public Service Commission set this date for a local public hearing to give members of the public a chance to comment about Liberty's General Rate Increase application. This is File No. GR-2024-0106.

The Commission regulates the rates charged by public utility companies in Missouri to ensure that those rates are just and reasonable. The Commission also regulates the quality of service and safety of the operations of public utilities.

There are five commissioners. They are appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate. The commissioners employ a staff of engineers, accountants, attorneys, financial analysts, and other specialists in the field of utility regulation.

My name is Charles Hatcher and I am the regulatory law judge that will preside over this

1	hearing. With me today are Commissioner Maida
2	Coleman. And as I said, on the Webex call we also
3	have Commissioners Jason Holsman, Glen Kolkmeyer, and
4	John Mitchell. The commissioners have not made any
5	decisions in this case and they cannot answer any
6	questions today because they need to remain impartial
7	until after all of the evidence is presented.
8	Let's go ahead and have the parties
9	introduce themselves. For Liberty.

4	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. Now, everyone
5	has previously been in attendance for the question
6	and answer session. Because, as I mentioned, the
7	commissioners are making the decision in this case,
8	they did not get to hear any of that information. So
9	we rely on witnesses to testify to the commissioners.
10	And the process for this hearing will be to call the
11	names on our sign-up list; I understand we only have
12	one name thus far, so after we call our witness, I
13	will then open the floor for anyone who did not
14	preregister, but who would still like to testify.
15	Sir, if you'd like to come on down and
16	step up to the microphone. Give us your your name
17	and address.
18	If you could please state and spell your
19	name, please, for the record.
20	MR. MITCHELL: Yes, your Honor. Wes,
21	W-e-s, Mitchell, M-i-t-c-h-e-l-l.
22	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Mr. Mitchell.

Τ	naving been first duly sworn, testified as
2	follows:
3	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. If you would
4	please go ahead and tell the commissioners your
5	comments.
6	THE WITNESS: Yes. Thank you for this
7	time. Fair and reasonable. That's a good question.
8	What is fair and reasonable. It's pretty subjective
9	I believe. It depends on your perspective. From my
10	perspective I think this rate increase is exorbitant.
11	I think it I would urge the Public Service
12	Commission to review this carefully and roll this
13	back because I think that rate increase that is
14	proposed is excessive. People are struggling, having
15	a hard time paying their bills already, and that
16	amount that Liberty is requesting is well in excess
17	of the rate of inflation. So I would submit that it
18	is excessive, and I would like to see that rolled
19	back by the PSC.
20	That's all I have to say, sir.
21	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. Are there any
22	questions from the commissioners? We do have one if
23	you'd hold on just a minute, Mr. Mitchell.
24	QUESTIONS
25	BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN:

Q. Good evening, Mr. Mitchell. Thank you for
being here tonight. We appreciate your participation
in this hearing. One of the concerns I always have
when we deal with utility companies is the quality of
service that the customers receive. I appreciate
your comments, but can you give me any insight as far
as your feelings regarding its customer service.

- A. Regarding overall customer service?
- Q. Yes, sir. Your experiences.
- 10 A. Well, I --

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- 11 Q. You are a customer of Liberty?
- 12 A. Yes, ma'am, I'm long-term customer.
- 13 Q. All right. Let's start there.
- 14 A. I live in Hannibal --
- 15 Q. All right.
 - A. -- and I didn't like the fact that they closed the offices to make payments.

And I have found that it's very confusing to find agents here locally. I looked on the website of payment agents and called some of them, a couple of pharmacies, called a couple of Dollar Stores that were listed and only one said that they took the payments and they knew very little about it. Now, I know most people use electronic media to make their payments, but not everyone has that. And I think



_	It's not the best customer service to not offer at
2	least a place to drop off a check, which they did
3	have until this spring. So I just feel like that is
4	a shortcoming as far as customer service, not having
5	a local office that you can deal with.
6	COMMISSIONER COLEMAN: Thank you,
7	Mr. Mitchell.
8	MR. MITCHELL: Thank you.
