ORDER APPROVING APPLICATION FOR VARIANCE

Issue Date: September 11, 2024 Effective Date: September 21, 2024

On July 30, 2024, The Empire District Electric Company d/b/a Liberty filed an application requesting a one-time variance to allow an industrial customer¹ to participate in Liberty's MEEIA programs for the current calendar year, 2024. That industrial customer previously opted out of MEEIA participation, and now seeks to revoke its opt-out. Additionally, the Company requested waiver of the 60-day notice of case filing requirement under 20 CSR 4240-4.017(1).

The variance requested is from Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-20.094(7)(K), which requires a customer to give notice two to four months in advance of the calendar year for which it will become eligible for the utility's demand-side program. The variance would allow immediate eligibility for the industrial customer. Liberty did not seek a variance from the portion of Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-20.094(7)(K) that requires a "customer revoking an opt-out to participate in demand-side programs . . . to remain in

the demand-side program(s) for the number of years over which the cost of that demandside program(s) is being recovered, or until the cost of their participation in the demandside program(s) has been recovered."

On August 29, 2024, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed its Recommendation. Staff recommended the Commission approve the application *so long as* the opt-out revocation applies to all of the customer's accounts in Liberty's territory. Staff's Recommendation indicated that Liberty and the customer understand that the opt-in will be for all accounts of the customer. Staff's Recommendation reiterated that the variance is not from the entirety of 20 CSR 4240-20.094(7)(K), but only to the portion specified regarding the two to four month notice requirement.

The Commission set a time for responses to Staff's Recommendation. No other responses to the application or to Staff's Recommendation have been received.

The Commission will grant Liberty's request for waiver of the 60-day notice requirement under 20 CSR 4240-4.017(1). The Commission finds good cause exists for waiver, based on the Company's verified declaration that it had no communication with the Commission regarding substantive issues in the application within 150 days before filing its application.² Because the application requested immediate eligibility for the customer, the Commission finds it reasonable to make this order effective in fewer than 30 days.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Liberty's application for a variance from Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-20.094(7)(K), is granted subject to the conditions that all of the customer's accounts

opt-in, and that the variance granted is only regarding the notice portion of the rule and is not a variance of the entirety of the rule.

- 2. The 60-day notice requirement of Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-4.017(1) is waived for good cause.
 - 3. This order shall be effective on September 21, 2024.
 - 4. This file shall close on September 22, 2024.
