NOTICE REGARDING 2019 RES COMPLIANCE PLAN

Issue Date: September 4, 2019

On April 15, 2019, KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company ("GMO") filed its Renewable Energy Standard Compliance Plan for 2019 ("Plan"), as it was required to do by Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-20.100(8). The Commission's rule requires the Staff of the Commission to review the utility's compliance report and plan and to file a report about its review within 45 days.¹

Staff filed a report on the Plan on May 30, 2019. Staff reported no deficiencies in the Plan.

The Commission's rule also allows Public Counsel and other interested persons or entities to file comments regarding GMO's Report.² The Office of the Public Counsel ("OPC") claims that GMO is out of compliance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-20.100(8)(B)1.F, which requires the calculation of a Renewable Energy Standard retail impact limit. OPC states that the Commission should require GMO to re-file its Plan in a

manner that accurately includes the costs resulting from the purchased power contracts for wind energy in the retail rate impact calculation.

On June 24, 2019, the Commission directed GMO and Staff to file additional information. Those parties complied on June 28, 2019.

The Commission's regulation does not specify what, if any, action the Commission is to take regarding GMO's Plan and any alleged deficiencies in that report and plan, except to allow the Commission to direct the utility to provide additional information or to address any concerns or deficiencies identified in the comments.³ After considering the submitted comments, the Commission concludes that no further order from the Commission is appropriate at this time.
