**ORDER DELEGATING AUTHORITY**

The Missouri Public Service Commission is delegating authority to rule on discovery matters. Commission regulation 4 CSR 240-2.090(1) allows discovery as provided for civil actions in circuit court. Commission regulation 4 CSR 240-2.090(2) provides for data requests. The statutes allow the Commission to delegate any Commission authority to any Commission employee.<sup>1</sup> Pursuant to that authority, the Commission specifically delegates authority to the regulatory law judge assigned to this case ("RLJ") as follows. The RLJ may convene any discovery conference. The RLJ may rule on any discovery dispute including any motion to compel compliance with discovery. Commission regulation 4 CSR 240-2.090(8) is waived.
