ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF, GIVING NOTICE OF CONTESTED CASE STATUS, AND DELEGATING AUTHORITY

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Issue Date: October 9, 2024

Effective Date: October 9, 2024

Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri submitted tariff sheets on September 30, 2024, to produce a net increase in its gas base rates of approximately \$39.6 million. The proposed tariff sheets have an effective date of November 1, 2024.

Section 393.150 RSMo (2016), authorizes the Commission to suspend the effective date of proposed tariff sheets for 120 days, plus an additional six months to allow for a hearing. To provide sufficient time to determine if the proposed tariff sheets are just and reasonable,¹ the Commission will suspend the tariff sheets for 120 days beyond their effective date. The Commission's experience demonstrates that a full hearing cannot be concluded within 120 days, so the Commission will suspend the tariff sheets for an additional six months.²

Section 393.150.1, RSMo, allows the suspension of the tariff pending a "full hearing" and decision on the tariff's propriety. Thus, this matter is a "contested case.³ A contested case is a formal hearing procedure, but it allows for waiver of procedural formalities and a decision without a hearing,⁴ including by stipulation and agreement.⁵ This order and notice does not require any party to file an answer. The Commission also provides notice that its discovery regulations may be found at 20 CSR 4240-2.090.

The Commission may delegate any adjudicative authority to the regulatory law judge assigned to this action.⁶ To ensure that all discovery disputes are ruled upon expeditiously, the Commission will delegate its authority to the regulatory law judge assigned to this action to rule on discovery disputes raised at the discovery conferences and to rule on all motions to compel discovery. The Commission will set forth further provisions for discovery by separate order when setting a full procedural schedule.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The proposed tariff sheets, filed under Tracking No. JG-2025-0045, by Ameren Missouri, are suspended for 120 days plus six months thereafter, until September 1, 2025.

2. The regulatory law judge assigned to this action shall have full authority to rule on any discovery dispute, including any motion to compel, and may make any such ruling at a discovery conference.
