Complainants Motion for Default Judgment & Motion to Compel

- 1) Complainant filed a complaint with the Commission on November 20, 2024
- 2) Ameren Missouri made an entry of appearance on November 21, 2024
- 3) The Commission ordered Ameren Missouri to file an answer within 30 days on November 21, 2024
- 4) Ameren Missouri's answer was due on December 20, 2024
- 5) Ameren Missouri did not file a timely answer in accordance with Missouri Public Service Commission rules, regulations and tariffs.
- 6) In addition, Ameren Missouri was made aware of discovery documents that Mr. Felber made Ameren aware of that would agree in accordance that Ameren Missouri did in fact commit a violation under Missouri Public Service Commission, rules and regulations, sections settlement and payment agreements, and disconnect notices.
- 7) All documents attached show Ameren Missouri is in clear violation of Missouri Public Service Commission rules and regulation, settlements & agreements, disconnections.
- 8) Ameren Missouri hasn't filed any pleadings or asking for an extension of time to file an answer.
- 9) Ameren Missouri's filing if late, should not get due process first over Mr. Felber's Motion for Default Judgment and Motion to Compel.
